From the Desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family, we have begun! We have begun our forty-day journey through Lent. My hope and prayer is that you are still focused on your Lenten commitment and if for some reason you have faltered, please pick yourself up and try to begin again.

This Sunday we hear one of what I and many other Scripture scholars consider to be the themes of St. Mark in his Gospel. We hear that "the Spirit <u>immediately</u> drove him out into the wilderness." The simple word "immediately" is used over forty times in Mark's Gospel. This may not seem like a point worth mentioning, but it is worthy of consideration since the other Gospel writers have not used the term to the same great extent. Most Scripture scholars acknowledge one of the main themes of Mark's Gospel to be the "Messianic Secret." The Messianic Secret means that Jesus wants people to figure out on their own, in their heart and soul, who exactly He is. We often hear Jesus say when healing someone to go and not tell anyone about this.

Another theme in Mark I believe is the theme of "immediately." What does this theme mean? I believe it is a call to put the Gospel of Jesus Christ as a priority. It is a summons to have the Kingdom of God as an urgent matter. In hearing that Jesus often acts with immediacy we also see others called to the same immediacy as His disciple. We are called this Lent to the same immediacy in our living of the Gospel message.

This year we had Ash Wednesday fall on the same day as Valentine's Day. This is the first time it has happened since 1945. Bishop Malone called us as Catholics to prioritize Ash Wednesday and to still celebrate Valentine's Day appropriately on another day. He even suggested creating a double celebration the day before, combining Mardi Gras and Valentine's Day. This received quite a bit of media attention as well as conversation among people. As with most things, some were thrilled that our Bishop spoke so clearly to lead us, while others laughed off the matter and said, "I'll do what I want on February 14." I believe this Ash Wednesday was a wonderful moment to check the very foundation of our own life. If I am a person of the Church and Faith, then Ash Wednesday took priority and with immediacy entered into these forty days of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We found another way to celebrate and/or another day to celebrate Valentine's Day. People more rooted in secular culture and celebration probably prioritized Valentine's Day dinner in a nice restaurant or setting and delayed entering into prayer, fasting and almsgiving. (cont'd from page 1) My assessment may be too simplistic, but I believe that the simple moments can define who we are and what we believe. How do you define yourself? Are you a person about the immediacy of the Gospel, or a person who delays living the Gospel message? Is there a facet of your life that you have not allowed the urgency of the Gospel to address? It is very easy for the relativism of the time to eclipse the immediacy of the Gospel. This eclipse can happen without our full awareness.

As we begin to live this Lenten experience, how immediately do you desire to bring the light of the Gospel alive within your own heart and soul? We are reminded that God desires to be the Lord of our entire mind, heart and soul. There is a fullness and immediacy to that desire of our God for us. As we begin to live the disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, is there one of the three we struggle more with accomplishing? If so, focus on that one in particular this Lent.

Of the three disciplines, fasting is probably the most difficult. We understand the need to pray and to be charitable, but we do not really understand the need to fast. As Americans, we do not like to fast. We live in a land of plenty and really in a culture of excess. Fasting takes many forms. We can fast from food and we certainly abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Fridays during Lent and Good Friday. In addition, we not only abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, but we also fast. Fasting on these days does not mean going out for a fish fry and a couple beers; it means going without food. Unfortunately we do not really know what it means to go without food. Fasting on these two days means that we eat very little. Two times we can take a small amount of food that in total does not equal one full meal, and also one time we take a very simple meal. Genuine fasting means that we do not eat at all and simply rely on drinking water. Fasting cleanses us in the long run and can purify our bodies. Fasting is also a difficult challenge as it calls us to go without. Did you really fast on Ash Wednesday and go without? Did you experience hunger? Will you do that on Good Friday? Will you fast not only from food, but also from other things during Lent (eg: television, video games, the internet, social media sites or other things)? These are great questions to ponder and to bring to life as we once again live prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

Respect Life

From Pope Francis' Angelus Message (2/4/18): Today in Italy, we celebrate Pro-Life Day which has as its theme, "The Gospel of life, joy for the world." I echo the message of the Bishops and express my appreciation and encouragement to the different ecclesiastical groups which promote and support life in many ways, in particular the pro-life movement; I greet its representatives present here — not very many. And this worries me. There are not many who fight for life; in a world where more and more weapons are built each day, where laws contrary to life are made daily; where a throwaway culture continues every day; the discarding of what is not useful, what is bothersome. Please let us pray that our people may be more conscious of the defense of life in this moment of destruction and rejection of humanity.

And now an announcement. Faced with the tragic prolonging of conflicts in various parts of the world, I invite all the faithful to join me in a Special Day of Prayer and Fasting for Peace on 23 February, the Friday of the First week of Lent. We will offer it in particular for the populations of the Democratic Republic of Congo and of South Sudan.

Our heavenly Father always listens to his children who cry out to him in pain and anguish; "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds" (Ps 147[146]:3). I launch a heartfelt appeal that we too may listen to this cry and each, according to his or her own conscience before God, can ask: "What can I do for peace?" We can certainly pray, but not only: each one can concretely say "no" to violence on his or her own behalf. Because the victories obtained through violence are false victories, whereas working for peace is good for everyone. (w2.vatican.va)


