

# Third Sunday of Lent

#### From the Desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family,

As we celebrate this Third Sunday of Lent, we are really in the heart and center of Lent. How are you doing? It can be around this time that we grow a little discouraged with our Lenten disciplines, and it can also be around this time that we can become even more challenged in remaining faithful and focused on our Lenten commitments. Stay the course! If you are remaining focused and strong; God bless you and your stamina. If you are starting to waiver a little; allow this message and this Sunday to be the "shot in the arm" that you need to move forward. If you have failed in some of your attempts this Lent; do not be defeated or discouraged, but rather pick yourself up and begin anew.

I have often wondered as I prayed the Stations of the Cross why we have three stations dedicated to Jesus' falling. Why did Jesus fall three times carrying the cross? Jesus was fully divine. He did not need to fall carrying the cross. We hear Jesus' prayer in the Garden that the "hour" might pass by Him. He prayed: "Abba, Father, all things are possible to you. Take this cup away from me, but not what I will, but what you will." I would believe that Jesus, being fully human and fully divine understood the excruciating suffering He was about to endure, but He also knew He must follow the will of the Father.

Why did Jesus fall three times? I believe that He fell three times to teach us in our humanity we will all fall, and probably fall multiple times. I believe He also taught us that when we fall from the weight of our sins or the weight of the burden of the sufferings of this world, we also must continually get up and continue to move forward in faith. This Lent, if you have fallen, do not be discouraged and disappointed, but get up and continue on your way. How are you doing?

One of the disciplines of Lent is that of almsgiving or charity. I am often questioned by people trying to discern the proper level of charity. How much am I to give? In scripture we are told to give the first fruits of our labor back to the Lord. We also understand we are to give the first ten percent of what we have to God. In the Gospel we honor the poor widow who gave the few coins as giving more than anyone else to the Temple treasury, because the others gave from their surplus wealth, and she gave all she had to live on – she gave from her own need. We also remember the unnamed wealthy man who did not attend to Lazarus the beggar at the gate of his home. (continued on page 2)

#### From the Desk of the Pastor

(cont'd from page 1) What will be your commitment to charity this Lent and, in particular, your commitment to Catholic Charities?

The needs are ever-growing in Western New York - the needs for individual and family counseling; the needs of the community in the midst of the opioid crisis; the needs for emergency shelter and food and clothing. There are great needs for refugees who have come to Western New York to begin a new life or be here for a short time before they move to where they hope they will find a new and permanent home. There is great need for job training and assistance to find work. Catholic Charities addresses all these things and much more.

This year I am asking all of us, myself included, to reflect on our call of almsgiving. It was the poor widow who was exalted as giving the most, rather than those who simply gave from their surplus wealth and probably didn't even realize any change in lifestyle because of their gift. Which person do you want to be? This is a great question for us to answer this Lent.

At St. Gregory's, only about one-third of our parishioners donate to Catholic Charities. For those who are the regular donors - I thank you from the depth of my heart and I pray you consider increasing your sacrifice for Catholic Charities this year. For those who once gave and for whatever reason have stopped - I ask you to prayerfully consider returning Catholic Charities to your charitable giving. Finally, there are many among us who have never given to Catholic Charities and become part of the many faces of the Body of Christ collectively giving to assist other many faces of the Body of Christ. We have countless faces known completely to God helping countless other faces also known completely to God. As we hear in scripture: "When giving alms, do not let your right hand know what your left hand is doing." I invite everyone to be counted among those who are willing to sacrifice, not just give from surplus, but to sacrifice for those in greater need. Permit me a simple example: if you have the habit of stopping daily to buy that morning cup of coffee (and I know how important it is - I too love my coffee first thing in the morning), can you consider giving an equal amount to Catholic Charities this year as you spend on coffee during the season of Lent or the seasons of Lent and Easter or even what you may spend during the entire year? Sacrifice for another person, especially one who cannot repay you or even thank you directly, is a great grace.

I hope you consider your focus of Lent, and within that focus your commitment this year to Catholic Charities. May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

To begin your journey to forgiveness and reconciliation, we encourage you to call or write for private counseling. We also provide counseling and services for those who have suffered a miscarriage, stillborn or death of a very young child.

There is hope after an abortion. It's normal to grieve a pregnancy loss, including the loss of a child by abortion. It can form a hole in one's heart, a hole so deep that sometimes it seems nothing can fill the empty spaces. We care. Let us help you."

# Cougars Corner

Greetings St. Greg's Parishioners,

Easter seems so far away, yet so close at the same time. Lent is a time of preparation of prayer and fasting in observance of the great sacrifice our Lord and Savior did for us. In teaching the young people the importance of the season. I also emphasize the importance of attending Mass. I often observe how packed the Church is at Easter and wonder why it isn't the same way during the off-season. I tell my students on a regular basis the importance of going to Mass, and as Catholics it is our obligation to go to church on a regular basis.

One of my projects for this Lent season for both 7th and 8th Graders is to go to Mass and journal about their experience. As you might understand, many students oppose this and often find ways not to do it. I have a story to tell about a young lady from a couple of years ago who was so against this project that she became defiant in class. I explained to her that it was an assignment and she had to figure out how she was going to complete it. Luckily, her parents were on board and took her to church regularly. After Easter was over and we were back in school, she handed the journal in. I was very reluctant to read this journal as I expected to read how bad her experience was and how much she disliked going to church. As it was time to read her journal, I was surprised to find that she not only reflected on what the priest was saying in his homily, but also how she could to relate to what the Gospel was telling her. On the last page of her journal she thanked me for following through with her and explained how she gained more respect for the Mass through this project.

I wanted to share this success story because I am encouraging you to not just attend Mass, but to openly talk about it with your family or friends. This year the 7th and 8th Graders are doing the same. If you see a student from St. Greg's School or see a young person taking notes in church, talk to them about it. I would love to read in their journals how a parishioner walked up to them and talked to them about the Mass. We have to instill this piece of Catholic identity in our young people that Mass is so very important to our spirituality.

### "SPIRITUAL SPINS & GRINS"

THE FIVE HABITS OF HIGHLY EFFECTIVE "PRAYERS"

People interviewed for Jim Castelli's book "How I Pray" suggest these ways to improve your capacity for reflection, whether or not you call it prayer.

- a. Take a few minutes early in the morning to clear your thoughts and set a goal and priorities for the day. If you exercise regularly, this is a great time to reflect as well.
- b. Use cues throughout the day to remind yourself that there is a dimension to life beyond racing from chore to chore, deadline to deadline, crisis to crisis. Archbishop Rembert Weakland (of Milwaukee) said he prays every time he opens the refrigerator or car door.
- c. Take a few seconds to reflect before any confrontation. Regrouping can help us say the right thing, or often and more important avoid saying the wrong thing.
- d. Do some reading that helps you think about your values, priorities, beliefs and ways to live better. This may mean the Bible, or spiritual readings. The important thing is to stimulate reflection.
- e. Make notes. Jotting down a thought or two can help you retain ideas, insights and goals that come in a flash during reflection, and then often slip away.
