

Happy Easter!! "The glorious Easter message, that Jesus Who was crucified is not here but risen (cf. *Mt* 28:5-6), offers us the comforting assurance that the abyss of death has been bridged and, with

it, all mourning, lamentation and pain (cf. Rev 21:4). The Lord, Who suffered abandonment..., the burden of an unjust condemnation and shame of an ignominious death, now makes us sharers of His immortal life and enables us to see with His eyes of love and compassion those who hunger and thirst, strangers and prisoners, the marginalized and the outcast, the victims of oppression and violence.
