#### From the Desk of the Pastor

My dear Parish family,

This past week we had the privilege to welcome our Ordinary, Most Reverend Richard Malone, to St. Gregory the Great to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation upon our teenagers. Both Tuesday and Thursday were wonderful celebrations. As I stated those evenings, I will repeat here, many thanks to all who made our celebration of Confirmation a wonderful experience. First, thank you to Arlene Meyerhofer who coordinates Confirmation for us, and Joan Rischmiller who brings everything together so beautifully in our Family Faith Formation office. Next, I thank all who made the liturgies so beautiful, including our Knights of Columbus, altar servers, sacristan, music ministry and our art & environment team. Finally, thank you to all of our Catechists and all those from both our Youth Ministry and Family Faith Formation who assisted me in leading our retreats. It is interesting to note that the majority of our newly Confirmed teens pointed to the retreat and especially the time of Eucharistic Adoration during the retreat as the key moment in their preparation for the Sacrament. Thank you to all and many congratulations to our newly Confirmed in Christ!

Bishop Malone raised a great question to our youth and really to each of us during his Confirmation homily. Bishop Malone asked directly who have we brought to faith by our lived example? He went to the point to ask our teenagers who in their school they could point to who have chosen to come to the Catholic Faith by their own personal witness of faith. That is an awesome question for us all. Bishop Malone went on to share a story about a teenage girl who was responsible for bringing two teenage guys to the Catholic Church because of her lived example and joy of the Gospel.

I recall my senior year at Riverside High School where I first had someone come to our Faith because of my invitation. My senior year English teacher, Miss Nowak, one day complimented me that I had my first convert to the Faith and that there would be a great reward in Heaven for me because of it. She witnessed my regular conversations with my classmate about matters of faith and church and she was, and still is, a woman of great Catholic Faith herself. (continued on page 2)

Who have you brought to faith by your example, invitation and encouragement? If we really are Disciples of Christ, that must be our primary goal. Today we live a more privatized faith life, I suppose, but why? That which is most important to us should be what we live, discuss and find enthusiasm and joy over living and sharing with others. If our own personal Discipleship in Christ is the most important part of our life, then we should generously share that with others. If our own personal Discipleship is simply **an important** element of our life, we might let those who are close to us know that detail. If we really have not given ourselves over to total Discipleship, but rather see our faith as one component of our life, calling others to Discipleship is a foreign subject. Who have you brought to faith by your example, invitation and encouragement? This is a great Easter guestion to ponder.

Many years ago while I was on vacation in Myrtle Beach, I went each morning to celebrate Mass at St. Andrew's Church on Ocean Boulevard. One day I went into the convenience store after Mass to pick up a few items. I was holding my Breviary, also known as the Liturgy of the Hours, in my hand as I placed my items on the counter for checkout. The young college-age girl who was working the counter pointed to my Breviary and asked, "Are you reading your scriptures too?" She seized the moment to share faith as she pointed to her Bible on the counter by the register. This young lady was a Disciple of Christ, who, I would say, saw her personal Discipleship in Christ as the most important part of her life and was willing to obviously share her faith with others.

The final words of the Gospel of Matthew, chapter 28, is the great commissioning to "go forth and baptize all nations in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and to teach them everything I have commanded you." This is the mandate of a true Disciple of Christ and a great commissioning and mandate for all of us to abide within.

Who have you brought to faith by your example, invitation and encouragement?

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

**Assisted Suicide Legalized in Hawaii:** On April 5, Governor David Ige (D) signed a new law that will allow terminally ill patients to end their lives by assisted suicide. The measure allows a doctor to prescribe lethal medication to mentally capable patients who have less than six months to live.

So-called "safeguards" have been built into the law that are supposed to protect people from abuse. These include a requirement that two doctors confirm that a patient is terminally ill with less than six months to live. Patients will be required to put their request in writing with two witnesses, with at least one witness not being a beneficiary of the patient's estate. The patient will have to wait 20 days before receiving their lethal prescription. Doctors who prescribe the drugs are also required to inform the patient of alternatives such as pain management and hospice care.

What the public is not being made aware of, however, is how easily these safeguards are being abused in other states where assisted suicide is legal.

For example, not allowing witnesses to be beneficiaries is easily gotten around. ...It's also important to note that patients and/or their guardians can shop around for doctors who are willing to say that the patient is capable, acting freely, and likely to die within six months. In fact, according to research, assisted suicide advocacy groups such as Compassion and Choices ...keep a list of "friendly" doctors.

[Furthermore], according to Richard Doeflinger, tens of thousands of people who qualify for hospice or who received the suicide drugs but didn't end up taking them, outlive their predicted six-month life expectancy.

Hawaii will now join Washington, Vermont, California, Colorado and the District of Columbia as the only U.S. states that have passed similar assisted suicide laws. (Full text at womenofgrace.com)

#### **Science Olympiad State Event**

Over this past weekend, April 14 & 15, we had the privilege to be a part of the St. Gregory's Science Olympiad State team. Our state competition was in Syracuse. Science Olympiad is a great way to find what you're truly passionate about in science, like being hands-on and taking-on making your own cart. Science Olympiad is a way to have fun with learning. The state competition is normally 2 days. You arrive on Friday and some of us have events while others just go to the hotel to calm down for a little bit and get ready for a fun pizza party. Then we are all allowed to go swimming and to bed at an early time so we can be ready for the day tomorrow when we will have the majority of our events. Saturday is all events and we are there from 7:00am to 6:00pm so our day is pretty packed. Then around 5:30pm we have our award ceremony to see how we placed and we are awarded medals between first place and tenth place.

Now we're going to tell you a little bit on how we had a lot of laughs. Some people can choose whether or not you want to not go to school on Friday and have your brain ready for your events or you can go to school to get your work. We drove together and we were there for our events. Then we went to the hotel for the pizza party and for a really fun pool party. We hung out with some of our friends and then we went to bed. For this task it was to make a catapult out of duct tape and launch it to a certain distance. We placed fifth in Road Scholar, which is an event basically going very deep into a topographic map. This is our last year for the 8th Graders to be part of the Science Olympiad team and we have to admit it was a really good State competition. Science Olympiad is about matching fun with learning and showing off your brainpower.
