From the desk of the Pastor

My dear Parish Family, we are a few days into the Lenten season – how are you doing?

I remember the "old" prayer or poem called **Foot- prints,** written by Mary Stevenson. It was popular in the 1970's and 1980's. I have copied it here for you to reflect upon:

One night I dreamed a dream.

As I was walking along the beach with my Lord.

Across the dark sky flashed scenes from my life.

For each scene, I noticed two sets of footprints in the sand,

One belonging to me and one to my Lord.

After the last scene of my life flashed before me, I looked back at the footprints in the sand. I noticed that at many times along the path of my life, especially at the very lowest and saddest times, there was only one set of footprints.

This really troubled me, so I asked the Lord about it.

"Lord, You said once I decided to follow You,
You'd walk with me all the way.
But I noticed that during the saddest and most troublesome times of my life,

there was only one set of footprints.

I don't understand why, when I needed You the most, You would leave me."

He whispered, "My precious child, I love you and will never leave you Never, ever, during your trials and testings.

When you saw only one set of footprints,
It was then that I carried you."

I believe we often see our lives like this prayer. It is easy to feel or see God's presence in our lives when things are going well. It is more difficult to feel or see God's presence in our lives when times are difficult. It is often difficult to recognize God's presence when we feel isolated, lonely or like everyone is against us. It is even harder to recognize those moments when God is carrying us as the prayer **Footprints** indicates.

This Lent we need to be cautious when we feel isolated or lonely because the world is against us. That the Devil can enter into our mind, heart and soul. Having these feelings can often lead to despair which is the Devil's welcome mat into our lives. God is Hope; the Devil is despair. We begin to question God's presence and action in our lives when we need and know that God is actually carrying us in His arms.

This is the very point that Moses was trying to drive home to the Israelite people as they wandered for forty years. God was with them, and God was carrying them, and it was their own stubbornness and rejection of God that caused their suffering and wandering in the desert. St. Paul in today's Letter to the Romans is reminding the early Christian community in Rome, and reminding us in Western New York, that God is near and that He is carrying us when times get difficult. All we need to do, according to St. Paul, is profess Jesus Christ to be our Lord and Savior and trust in Him.

Jesus Himself was not spared temptation. Remember He was like us in every way but sin. We are not alone in our suffering, losses, frustrations, challenges, differences of opinion. We are not alone in our time of temptation and we are still not alone in our time of sin. God is always there to extend mercy and forgiveness. I often wonder why Jesus fell three times carrying the cross? Jesus did not need to fall carrying the cross. I believe that Jesus fell the three times to remind us that we will fall repeatedly throughout our lives, but what we need to do it to pick ourselves up, brush ourselves off and continue to move forward. Along the way we also need to accept some help, as Jesus accepted the help of Simon to carry the cross.

As we begin this Lent, do you see two sets of footprints? If you only see one set at times, do you recognize that those are the moments that Jesus was carrying you? When you see one set of footprints can you recognize that it was Jesus carrying you through the efforts of a family member or friend or church minister?

The number forty is huge in the Bible. Remember it rained for forty days and nights to renew creation and cleanse the earth. It was forty years than an entire generation that wandered and died in the desert in order to have enough faith and trust in God to enter the Promised Land.

This Sunday we are reminded that Jesus Himself spent forty days in the desert and was strengthened by it! Although the Devil tried to use the Scripture to trip Jesus up, Jesus used the Scripture to prove His Father's faithfulness to Himself and all of us. So often, those who disagree with our Church's theological beliefs and/or moral way of life will use quotes from the Bible to try and prove we are "wrong." It is our call to be so intimate with Scripture that we can be more like Jesus and use His very Word in the Bible to prove our faith and trust in His Truth when we enter such conversations.

Our forty days of Lent may be just that call of more intimacy with God's word – to read it; meditate upon it; know it; like it; live it and love it! Maybe more importantly than giving up candy or a glass of wine (these are good things to do too to teach us discipline) is to spend some forty days meditating on Jesus' Word and allowing it to permeate our mind, heart and soul. The number forty in the Scripture usually means a time of testing or purification or a time of judgement. For our forty days allow it to be a time of strengthening your knowledge of Jesus' Word, His presence in the Eucharist and His carrying you in His arms when times get tough.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.


