Today I would like to reflect on today's gospel of John 6:34-35.

So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

This passage begins Jesus' discourse on the Bread of Life which will be read at Mass over the next few weeks. We will see Jesus giving His followers so much more than mere bread and fish. We listen to Him speak of Himself as the true Bread from Heaven.

Sadly, many reject this precious teaching and gift and go their own way. But what about you? How often have you truly pondered these words of Jesus? "I am the Bread of Life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst!" Do you believe this? Deep within every human heart is a hunger and thirst that longs to be satisfied. We try to fill it with so many things, but in the end only one thing satisfies.

Jesus alone can satisfy the deepest longings of our souls. When you go to Mass, do you long to receive Him and enter into communion with Him? Perhaps, but perhaps not. We all need to redirect our desires towards our wonderful Savior, especially as He comes to us in the Eucharist.

Reflect today upon how deeply you believe in these words of Jesus. Do you regularly meet Him in the Eucharist? If you cannot say "Yes" to this in a complete and definitive way, then resolve today to renew your love for Jesus in the beautiful sacrament of the Eucharist.

Novena for the Legal Protection of Human Life: Cardinal Timothy Dolan, Archbishop of New York and Chairman of the USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities, invites all people to join in a prayer campaign that the change in the U.S. Supreme Court will move our nation closer to the day when every human being is protected in law and welcomed in life. As soon as Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy announced his retirement, proabortion groups began lobbying the U.S. Senate to reject any nominee who does not promise to endorse Roe v. Wade. While the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops does not support or oppose the confirmation of any presidential nominee, we can and should raise grave concerns about a confirmation process which is being grossly distorted by efforts to subject judicial nominees to a litmus test of support for Roe v. 


