From the Desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family, this weekend I wish to extend a few words of congratulations. I also wish to address a matter of concern for our parish family with you.

This program allows our boys to develop a fuller Christian life by studying the seven sacraments. Congratulations guys!

During that time of prayer I lead our youth in a meditation to discover our Lord speaking to them in the depth of their heart. After our time of meditation I invite our youth to come, if they wish, to kneel beside me in front of the Altar with the Eucharist and to share with me their prayer intentions. It is awesome that the vast majority of our teens come for that moment of prayer. It is a humbling time for them to bear their inner prayer intentions with me and together we kneel in prayer. I look forward to a similar time with our youth in preparation for next year's Confirmation. Congratulations!

As you know, the last two weekends, and this weekend as well, each parish in the Diocese has the attendance being counted and recorded at the request of Bishop Malone. I do not know of a parish in the Diocese that has not seen a decline in Mass attendance in the last couple years. St. Gregory's is not an exception. We too have seen a decline in the number of people attending Mass. Malone has established a task force to look at the hard numbers of people regularly attending Mass on the weekends. This task force will make recommendations to all of the parishes of the Diocese to adjust their Mass schedules. A Sunday Mass is to be regularly filled to allow for a spirited and vibrant celebration of the Eucharist. Our Bishop is also concerned over the declining number of priests and the much smaller number of priests virtually doing all the work (Masses, all sacraments and many ministries) that was once accomplished by many more priests. Bishop Malone is concerned over the long term health and welfare of his priests. I will keep you informed of any changes proposed by this task force as this process unfolds.

Along with the decline in attendance, virtually every parish in the Diocese is also seeing a decline in the Sunday collection. At recent Vicariate meetings, we have discussed this issue as pastors. It appears the decline in regular Mass attendance, the death of many of our long- time and generous parishioners, the effect of a five year commitment of some to Upon This Rock and most recently the ongoing clergy abuse crisis have all taken their effect on the Sunday offertory. We have also seen this decline at St. Gregory's. I am appealing to you to prayerfully consider your current situation and your ability to increase your weekly offering. making changes to our spending at St. Gregory's especially as we prepare the budget beginning on September 1st for the new fiscal year. Both our parish and school budgets have gaps that need to be closed due to a decline in school enrollment, Sunday collections and fundraising efforts. With our Director of Communications leaving, we will not be filling that full- time position. We are also eliminating our parish's sponsorship of some Diocesan events and programs. Effective immediately we are eliminating the gifts of a book or CD given at Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter and Mother's and Father's Day. Believe it or not, just that line on our budget is about \$20,000. I am thankful to our parish Finance Committee and our parish business office staff for their diligent work on this matter. Please prayerfully consider what you may be able to do to allow St. Gregory's to continue to afford the many wonderful ministries it now enjoys.

Stop Physician-Assisted Suicide in NY: On April 23, opponents of legalizing physician-assisted suicide, including a group from the Diocese of Buffalo, went to Albany to participate in an Assembly Health Committee Hearing. They spoke out against the proposed "Medical Aid-In-Dying" Act (A.2383-A/S.3151-A) which is currently under

legislative review. According to the NYS Catholic Conference, the bill has many flaws which put vulnerable patients at risk for abuse.

Problems with the bill include:

- The definition of "terminal illness or condition" increases the risk of errors in diagnosis. To qualify, a patient must have "an incurable and irreversible illness or condition that has been medically confirmed and will, ... produce death within six months." The standards for making this determination are "significantly weaker" than is used in other parts of NYS law. Consequently, "virtually anything could qualify under this definition."
- No psychological screening, counseling, diagnosis or treatment [of the patient] is required. There is no mandatory referral of the patient to a psychiatrist to determine if they are suffering from a treatable mental illness (e.g., clinical depression). Also, there is no requirement that the patient's family be notified.
- There are no protections for the patient after the drugs are dispensed. There is no oversight as to when, where, with whom, etc. the patient takes the lethal dosage of medication. There is no way to ensure that the patient isn't being coerced into committing suicide. No physician...is required to be present [when] the patient takes the lethal pills, so the patient may suffer unnecessarily.
- There is inadequate conscience protection for individuals. The terms [in the bill] are not broad enough to encompass all religious or moral objections to participating in assisted suicide (counseling, referring, etc.). [The bill] also does not... protect those who provide indirect assistance, such as the pharmacist. For more information, go to nyscatholic.org







Let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." (1 John 3:18) Saying "I love you" is good. Doing an act of kindness is an even stronger testament of love. Use both "love languages" once today.

Do you really listen to your child? Of course you do. Now be honest. Do you sometimes "listen with your answer running?" Today, just for today, pay attention to a request your child makes and look for the reason behind the request before automatically saying, "No."
