


MESSAGE FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR



My Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday is Gaudete Sunday or "Rejoice" Sunday. The third Sunday of Advent always calls us to rejoice in the midst of our Advent preparation of penance, reflection and prayer. Why? Why are we called to rejoice especially this year when we have and still are suffering so much as a Diocese and Church throughout the world? Why are we called to rejoice in the midst of personal suffering, illness and hardships?

This Sunday the prophet Isaiah reminds us that flowers will still bloom even in the desert. Isaiah gives us hope! We are people of hope and hope triumphs over suffering, death and burdens. St. James, in the second reading this weekend, gives us the key ingredients to hope in the midst of suffering. He tells us to be patient, firm and positive. The message of Advent which is the message of John the Baptist is that God has heard his people's plea and has sent us a Savior, Jesus Christ.

The goal of a Catholic, and indeed all Christians, is to rejoice always and to especially strive to rejoice in the midst of suffering and difficulty because we have a neverending hope. Do you have that hope? Are you able to embrace suffering rather than repel it? What is your focus of life? I suppose the ultimate old question: "Is the glass half empty or half full?"

Last weekend we hosted the annual Diocesan Scout Retreat at St. Greg's. It was Friday overnight through Saturday evening. All of the discussions we had with the 19 Scouts who made the retreat focused on joy, and in particular the joy we glean from living the spiritual focus of the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary. We looked upon our ability to actually listen to God as did Mary in the Annunciation and how we can respond with a full "yes" and not with a conditional or partial one. We looked on the call to go out and serve even in the midst of our own needs, as Mary did in the Visitation with her cousin Elizabeth. We looked at how we witness the birth or the "breaking into

the world today" of Jesus; and our call to bring our belief in the Nativity of old and the Nativity of Jesus being born through our words and actions. We looked at how we ponder Jesus' real presence, especially in the Eucharist, and can be filled with awe and wonder today as Mary was in the Presentation in the Temple. Mary pondered and treasured all of what Simeon and Anna spoke about the baby Jesus. We too can ponder and treasure and be filled with awe each time we come to Eucharistic Adoration. Our Scouts experienced that as we celebrated Adoration with them. Some of the Scouts mentioned their feelings of peace and freedom from their problems as I led them in meditation during Adoration. Finally, we reflected on the call to "be about the Father's business" in our lives as Jesus asked his parents "did you not know I must be about my Father's business" when they found him in the Temple in the fifth and final decade of the Joyful Mysteries.

In my small-group discussion, I asked the Scouts if they see their peers in school smile. I received a rather unanimous "no" in reply. We discussed that fewer and fewer people smile today. Our youth notice it and many of us adults also have noticed it. Why? Perhaps we have lost

our joy and our hope, and this Advent is the call to rediscover it. Flowers do bloom in the desert. I was in the desert in Israel and Jordan and I have been in the desert in Arizona. I have seen beautiful flowers bloom in the midst of what seems to be a dry, barren wasteland. Do you see the flowers blooming in our midst during this challenging time?

In a time when the Diocese has a crisis we had 19 Scouts volunteer to be part of an overnight retreat – flowers in the desert. This weekend we had record numbers (registration at the time of writing this article is about 70 junior- high teens of St. Greg's) sign up to participate in the overnight middle-school youth ministry weekend on our property. These are flowers in the desert. Last week we experienced an awesome Night of Advent Reflection lead by members of our own staff (Michael Cygan, Nancy Erdman, Brian Ruh, Nicole Janacek and Father Paul and myself). There were a couple hundred parishioners in attendance. I have received numerous phone calls, text messages notes and e-mails thanking me for so wonderful a night. Flowers in the desert! The weekend after Thanksgiving we had an awesome Craft Show. I know we had over 1800 people come just on Friday and probably over 3000 by the end of Saturday. We thank Lori Cinquino for her, and her family's, great effort every year to provide this craft show. This year some in the community referred to it as an "event not to be missed" and "second in size only to the one in Letchworth State Park." Flowers in the desert! In November we had our Parish Auction and witnessed about a twenty-five percent increase in both attendance as well as profit to assist with running our school and parish ministries. Flowers in the midst of the desert! Also in November we had over forty of our Young Adults from St. Greg's participate in the annual Young-Adult three-day weekend retreat. Flowers in the desert - alive and well!

This weekend ask yourself if you see the flowers in the desert? Do you see the hope and joy? Is the glass half full or half empty? Ultimately we become what we focus upon. If we see the hope of God in the midst of suffering, we will be hopeful; if we see only despair and pain, we will become despair itself.

Finally, we welcome, Bishop Edward Scharfenberger to our Diocese of Buffalo. He serves as our Administrator until Pope Francis appoints a new Bishop for our Diocese. Please pray for Bishop Scharfenberger as he leads us and please see this time of transition as a time of hope and promise in the midst of our Diocesan suffering. Welcome Bishop Scharfenberger!

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

WHAT'S THE GOOD WORD?

One of the areas of focus for evangelization is reaching out to the 2600 families we have not seen in years and discern why they no longer celebrate with us and invite them back. After connecting this family with Joan Rischmiller, our Director of Family Faith Formation, these youth are now closer to receiving the Eucharist. Another story I share involves speaking with a young woman who recently graduated, found a job out of state, is newly engaged and connected with a parish in Philadelphia. She and her fiancé will be taking Pre-CANA classes there and planning to get married back here at St. Greg's.

Many St. Greg's ministries use this space daily and this new environment will allow for a shared campus community that we can all take pride in.

Our hope is that the new 21st century design will create a sense of community and respect. It has been proven that smaller group environments help to develop stronger relationships between students which lead to overall positivity. We want our students and visitors to connect with each other in this smaller group setting.

We are thrilled with the setup and look forward to the friend-ships that will develop with this new cafeteria design. Thank you to our parents and staff who helped with this project, from the funding of the Great Dinner Auction item, to meeting with designers, to helping assemble and set up the tables. We are grateful to each of you for your continued support of our school and our students. Thank you Fr. Paul, Fr. Moses, and Seminarian Joe for coming by to bless the new cafeteria! It truly takes a village to create positive change!


