the ability to rejoice in the midst of a very difficult time for our Diocese and Catholic Church. It is easy to be drawn into the media and the daily conversations about the problems in the Church, especially with its priests, but we cannot allow these stories to eclipse the fact that the work of the Church continues and that there is a reason to also rejoice. There is still light penetrating the darkness of this time.

I returned on December 1 and in the short time that I have been back from my sabbatical I have seen marvelous things. By and large the ministries of the parish are still vibrant and strong. We just had nearly 80 junior-high teens participate in last weekend's "Middle School Mayhem" on Friday and Saturday. We have six people looking to become Catholic in the RCIA process. We just added 45 new Altar Servers to the ranks of that ministry. The list can go on and on further. I hope you see my point, that there is light shining through the darkness of this hour. I hope you are still able to rejoice in the midst of suffering.

Now, not to reverse my statements above, I do need to address some serious issues that have come to my attention since my return from my sabbatical. Since my return I have learned that Mass attendance is down. Every parish in the Diocese is experiencing this issue, given the scandal. I am most thankful that you are still actively participating in the Eucharist. If you are reading this article, I assume you are the light of faithfulness penetrating the darkness of doubt and disillusionment.

December 15 & 16, 2018

Many of our brothers and sisters in Christ are questioning their faith. For some, this scandal has been a personal issue and an issue close to home. It is devastating for everyone and perhaps completely destructive for some people. It is important for us to reach out to those who feel they can no longer worship with us and it is very important to pray daily for their spiritual well-being. It is vitally important to reach out and invite them to Mass and the Sacraments. (Continued on page 2)

I have also learned that our Sunday collection has decreased by 18%. This is a mater sum of money that will immediately impact our ability to live life as usual. I am aware that many have stopped donating to St. Gregory's because of the scandal. Some have directly spoken to me about it and others have spoken to the other priests in my absence. Some have not spoken to us directly, but we have noticed once-regular donors now no longer giving at all.

Of course I am troubled by this, as we rely on our Sunday offering to offer the ministries serving the people of St. Greg's and beyond. I have come to understand that some believe their Sunday offerings are going to pay settlements and legal fees during this crisis. I do not know where that idea has emerged. Bishop Malone has been clear to tell us that a separate "Independent Reconciliation Fund" has been established which does not draw from the parishes, but is redeploying other Diocesan funds and assets, such as the Bishop's former residence on Oakland Place in the City of Buffalo, to meet these obligations. The parish Sunday offering is just that, the Parish offer-There is a percentage of every parish's ina. income that goes as an assessment to the Diocese, but that assessment is used to run the Diocesan offices and Diocesan ministries.

That being said, I regret to inform you of the following items. Beginning immediately, we must cut our expenses. As you know, when I arrived on February 2, 2014, the parish office was open Monday through Friday, from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm. I quickly changed that to be more accommodating for people to come to the parish office. I extended our hours to include Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evening hours from 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm and Saturday hours of 9:00 am to 4:00 pm and now even Sunday hours from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. However, to meet some of our fiscal shortfall, the parish office hours will return to Monday through Friday 8:30 am to 4:00 pm with no evening hours, and on Saturday from 9:00 am to 4:00, with no hours on Sunday. Furthermore the priests will only be available to meet with people during regular parish office hours when our regular staff is in the office. There will be no exceptions to this. I am sorry for the inconveniences this may pose, but given the climate we are in we must be prudent. If our Sunday collection returns to our regular amounts I will be most happy to extend office hours again.

In order to help close the fiscal gaps, we have completely eliminated the Advent and Lent Reflection Books as well as the books or CDs that we have given to you on Christmas, Easter, Mother's Day and Father's Day. This will be approximately a \$20,000 savings. Also, I ask you to please dress a little warmer for Mass. The church has been kept at 71 degrees and we will be lowering that to 65 degrees, to reduce our utility cost. Finally, I have asked each ministry funded by the parish to minimally decrease their spending by 10% and to look to a possible 20% reduction.

I am sorry to be the bearer of "bad tidings" as we prepare to hear the "great tidings" of the birth of our Savior this Christmas. I do not want you to give way to despair, but rather hope. Our Church has suffered many moments of crisis over 2000 years and we have always survived and emerged stronger for suffering through the crisis. I am certain the same will be true now. I thank you for all of your support of St. Greg's and I humbly ask you to consider if you can increase your support, or to return to the list of donors if you have absented yourself from donating.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

# Respect Life

**Update on HHS Mandate**: On November 7, the Departments of Health and Human Services (HHS), Treasury, and Labor released two updated rules con-

cerning conscience protections for organizations and individuals in relation to the HHS contraception mandate.

According to [the] HHS, the new rules "provide an exemption from the contraceptive coverage mandate to entities and individuals that object to [such] services ...on the basis of sincerely held religious beliefs [and thus they are] ...no longer ...required to provide such coverage."

The new rules also cover nonprofit organizations, small businesses, and individuals that have "non-religious moral convictions" opposed to the services covered by the mandate.

Under the Affordable Care Act, employer-provided health insurance plans are required to cover certain "preventative services" ...including all contraception methods approved by the Food and Drug Administration, including abortifacient birth control pills, IUDs, and sterilization procedures.

Initially, there were no exemptions for those opposed to the distribution of contraceptives due to their deeply-held religious beliefs. Eventually, an exemption was made, but it was so narrow in scope it excluded religious orders such as the Little Sisters of the Poor. The Little Sisters along with several other organizations filed suit against HHS over the mandate.

The HHS also confirmed that government programs providing contraception either for free or at a lower cost to lowincome women will not be impacted by these new rules. (Full text at catholicnewsagency.com)

The US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) issued a statement expressing gratitude for the new exemptions, calling it a victory for common sense.

"We are grateful for the Administration's decision to finalize common-sense regulations that allows those with sincerely held religious or moral convictions opposing abortion-inducing drugs, sterilization, and contraception to exclude such drugs and devices from their health plans."


