## From the desk of the Pastor

My Dear Parish Family, as we make our final preparation for the celebration of Christmas, I encourage you to take a moment to spiritually open your mind, heart and soul in a greater way, to deepen your relationship with Jesus Christ our Savior. The hustle and bustle of these days can eclipse what we are celebrating. Rather than becoming more loving, we can become more frustrated, angry and concerned that our Christmas plans are not working as we desire. As we celebrate God's gift of perfect love, may we imitate His love in forgiveness, works of charity and genuine desire to serve the needs of others.

I would like to make you aware of some major changes that will be coming to St. Gregory the Great Church. As you recall, the "Upon this Rock Campaign" was intended to utilize our parish's 35% share of the donations to renovate our church. On Monday, January 14, the church renovation will begin.

The church building will close from January 14 until Palm Sunday. All Masses and Church services will be held in the Ministry Center at their normal scheduled times. There are **no changes to Mass times or schedule** during this renovation. It is more efficient and quicker to complete the work if the contractors have full access to the building. I apologize for any inconvenience now and for any caused during this project. **(Continued on Page 2)**

Some may question why we are doing this work when our Sunday collections have declined as reported in last weekend's Bulletin? The answer is simple: the payment for this work is from the "Upon this Rock" campaign. As people have honored their pledge payments, we have received our disbursements, and the funds raised from "Upon this Rock" must be spent as proposed during the campaign. Thank you to all who contributed and to all who are continuing to honor their pledge.

Finally, some may question, why are we doing this now with all of the unrest in the Church over the recent scandal in the Diocese? Simply, while the Diocese is addressing the matters of the scandal, the work of the Church must continue. We are doing needed capital repairs. With much of this work, the longer we wait to begin will result in the condition of our church being even more weakened. been 20 years since anything really has been done to our church's general condition. Weekly I get complaints about broken kneelers and pews. Twenty years for a coat of paint in a building used as much as our church is a pretty good lifespan.

I am confident that when this project is completed you will see and be very proud of the final result. Just as you take pride in a renovation project in your home (a new kitchen or bath or a remodeled basement or addition to the house), we hope you will take pride in the renovation project of our home; our church home.

And the King will say to them in reply, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did it for me."




# St. Gregory the Great School News


