From the desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family, first, I wish to thank you for your many kind words of affirmation for our church renovation project. I am grateful that my speaking at all of the Masses last weekend clarified and explained the scope and purpose for our work. At the time of my writing this article, two questions have surfaced which I would like to answer here.

First, there was a question regarding handicapped parking at the Ministry Center. Although there are already designated handicapped spots by the Ministry Center, we are adding several temporary handicapped parking spots by that building. Our maintenance staff is taking care of making the signs and placing them. Secondly, there was a question about confessionals in the Ministry Center. Unfortunately, there will not be individual confessionals in the Ministry Center as we are used to having in the church itself. They simply do not exist. Confessions will take place as usual on Saturday's from 2:30 pm to 3:45 pm. Our plan is for the priests to simply be sitting in different areas of the Ministry Center worship space to hear Confession. Those who come to Confession will need to maintain a practical distance away from the priest to allow for privacy. Those coming in for Mass will need to do the same. I suppose this is one of the areas that will require the flexibility and patience that I spoke of at Masses last weekend. Actually, some parishes have gone to this method of Confession permanently now and are no longer using the old traditional confessionals. We do intend to have additional Confessions available during Lent on Wednesdays from 5:00 to 7:00 pm as we have done in the last couple years. I am sorry for the inconvenience, but it is simply the best we can do as there are no real individual rooms to utilize for confessionals in the Ministry Center.

This Sunday we celebrate the end of the Christmas Season with the Baptism of our Lord. This Sunday is also a perfect Sunday to reflect on the meaning of our own Baptism. It is through the waters of Baptism that we are washed of our sins, joined to the Body of Christ and really "pass from death to life." Baptism calls us to die to sin and to rise with Christ and live His Gospel. What does that really mean and how aware are we of our Baptism? Do we see our Discipleship in Christ as a "matter of life and death?"

Baptism is the first Sacrament and the gateway to all of the Sacraments of the Church. Do we see when we ask to have a baby Baptized that we are choosing a real way of life for them and taking on a real responsibility for ourselves as a parent or Godparent? For some, I know they do recognize this power and responsibility, but for others, I fear it may be just an empty old custom. As parents and Godparents we have a real responsibility to share our Faith with those we bring into the world and sponsor for Baptism. We are to use our lives to share and help form the next generation of Disciples for Christ. This is especially done as others observe the way we live, speak and act. It is also accomplished by having meaningful conversations where we approach the matters of faith and how they relate to the current issues of our world. (Continued on Page 2)

Do we live like Jesus and His teachings are "a matter of life and death?" This is an important question to ponder. I suppose every person has a set of values by which they make judgements and decisions. What is your set of values? Are they Christ's or some other system of belief? If each of us can answer these questions, I believe we will then discover what we will personally "live or die for." We use that phrase often, "live or die for," especially as we are looking to make a decision that involves many individuals. The "live or die for" list of values comes into play at moments of compromise. We see this principle at work in political circles as well as at our places of employment and among family and friends who debate issues or come to some course of action.

This Sunday, please consider what you will "live or die" for. Will you "live or die"? for the values of the Gospel of Jesus Christ? What does your Baptism really mean to you, and do you remind yourself of your Baptism every time you make the sign of the Cross, especially when you do so after dipping you hand in the Holy Water font reminiscent of Baptism?

Respect Life

New York State Abortion Expansion Bill:

Governor Cuomo is pledging to pass his Abortion Expansion Bill (formerly known as the Reproductive Health Act) within the first 30 days of the 2019 legislative session. Unfortunately, since the 2018 mid-term elections created a new Democrat majority in the State Senate, it is likely that this time Cuomo will have the votes to pass the legislation. This law would have devastating consequences for the unborn and remove some existing safeguards protecting women's health.

According to the NYS Catholic Conference, the Governor's bill is a radical proposal that would give New York the most liberal abortion laws in the world -- in fact, it would remove any limitations on abortion from NYS law. It would:

Encourage more late-term abortions – by removing the current law's limit on abortions after 24 weeks and allow abortion up to nine months' gestation.

Permit non-doctors to do abortions.

Eliminate all criminal penalties for abortions – so even if an abortion was involuntary or coerced, it could not be prosecuted.

Endanger children after birth by eliminating a law that requires that a baby born alive after an abortion be given adequate health care. Instead, this bill would allow abortionists to leave those children to die of neglect and starvation.
