#### From the desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family, we have begun! The renovation project is off and running and seems to be progressing nicely at this one-week mark. I've included a photo from Tuesday of this past week. As you can see, by Tuesday a good deal of progress had already been made.

An additional renovation question that seems to be surfacing is in regards to the Eucharistic Adoration Chapel. The Adoration Chapel remains open 24/7 as always. Although we do not expect the Chapel to be affected by the renovation, we will do our best to notify you of any changes that may arise. We will minimally place a notification on the outside doors leading to the Chapel if there should be any disruption involving the Chapel.

This weekend we once again focus on the importance of human life. January  $22^{nd}$  will mark another anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court ruling regarding abortion. The annual "March for Life" was held in Washington D.C. this past week. Also, our local New York State news includes the "Reproductive Health Care Act" being put forward by our Governor. It is mindboggling to consider that Governor Cuomo is staunchly putting forward no limit to when an abortion can be performed during the nine month pregnancy period up to and including the mother's due date. The New York State Catholic Conference has put out a statement regarding this matter. I advise you to pick up a copy of the statement which we have available at the doors of the Ministry Center. I urge you to act upon it as indicated by our Bishops.

Briefly, according to the Catholic Conference statement, this is the core of the issue:

"Sadly, New York State is the Abortion Capital of our nation, with a rate of 29.6 abortions for every 1,000 women of reproductive age. That's more than twice the national average.

New York legalized abortion in 1970, three years before the U.S. Supreme Court ruled in *Roe vs.Wade*. **(Continued on page 2)**

## (From the desk of the Pastor Continued)

Abortion is legal here for any reason up to 24 weeks of pregnancy, and any time after that if the mother's life is at risk. So even if Roe were to be overruled the vast majority of abortions in our state would continue to be legal and available.

The Governor and the Democratic leadership in the New York State Legislature want to go even further, and make abortion less safe and more expansive than it is now. They've promised to enact the so-called "Reproductive Health Act" early in 2019. This bill would:

 $\Box$  Allow non-doctors to perform abortions.

□□Allow abortions for any reason in the third trimester of pregnancy right up to a mother's due date.

□□Remove all criminal penalties for abortion, even if it was contrary to the mother's choice, such as the intentional targeting of an unborn child in an act of violence.

□□Remove our state's protections for infants accidentally born alive in the course of an abortion."

The Roman Catholic Church is a pro-life church. We firmly believe that God is the author of all life and God alone determines when life begins and ends. This is the basic foundation for our belief in protecting all life from natural conception until natural death.

I have stated many times, and repeat here again, as long as we have violence allowed and legalized within the womb we will always have violence outside of the womb. It is illogical to believe that a society can tolerate the murder of innocent lives before they are born and at the same time fight against violence and murder outside of the womb. These are not independent actions, but are philosophically connected. Either our society is pro-life or pro-death. There is no middle ground. The so called "pro-choice" movement is really a choice for selfishness and death. Those who propose the termination of life within the womb are directly causing the lack of respect which leads to bullying, violence and murder outside of the womb. In other words, they are proposing a culture of death and not consistently supporting a culture of life.

I urge you strongly to write and call your elected State officials in the Assembly and Senate as well as our Governor and voice the truth of a stand for human life. On behalf of the unborn, I thank you for your time and prayer and physical action on this matter. May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.
