### From the desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family, we are about one-third of the way thru our time of "exile" from our church. It seems that the renovation work is progressing nicely. I wish to thank all those who called to memorialize items for our new sanctuary. At the time of writing this article, only the processional candle sticks for the sides of the altar remain on the list to memorialize.

I mentioned at the beginning of our project that things would come up that would require our attention. When I spoke those words I suppose I was thinking of physical things needing repair or replacement. We have run across some of those types of items. Last week I became aware of a spiritual matter that requires our attention and reflection.

In the last week or two, I have had many conversations with people about Mass in the Ministry Center. Some people actually like the experience. Almost everyone has commented that the sound system in the Ministry Center is far better than the one in our church. Some people have told me that they haven't been able to hear in church for years and in the Ministry Center they can hear just fine. Some people do not like attending Mass in the Ministry Center. I can certainly understand that. We are used to celebrating in a church building and not a gymnasium.

#### **Heart-To-Heart Food Drive Thank You!**

On behalf of the Family Faith Formation Office and St. Vincent De Paul Society, thank you for your generosity.

Last week I celebrated a funeral for one of our founding parishioners. His family clearly was disappointed that the Mass could not be in the Church which was close to their father's heart and close to their family, but they also said, "Where else would we go – this is our parish." This is an awesome attitude! These experiences have called me to reflect on the nature of parish family life.

I have learned that some people refuse to come to the Ministry Center for Mass and we have had a number of parishioners who have passed away whose families have not even notified us of the death let alone come to St. Greg's for the funeral Mass because it would be in the Ministry Center. This saddens me.

#### (From the desk of the Pastor Continued)

As we continue to go through this time of displacement, maybe we can take some time to reflect on which is more important: the community of people or the buildings of the parish? Getting to know other people in our parish family is a particular challenge for a parish of our size and nature. Many old city or neighborhood parishes had a natural community as people lived, worked, went to school, and worshipped together. I suppose the same is true today, but the number of people involved has changed and the very nature of what we value in life has changed. What is the focus of your life?

This Sunday we hear the Gospel of Luke's version of the Beatitudes. Although there are many similarities in comparison to Matthew's version of the Sermon on the Mount, Luke writes in a different way. He essentially divides them in half and we hear of the blessings and of the woes. The first reading from Jeremiah and the Psalm (Psalm 1) and the Gospel basically give a choice between two focuses of life. On one hand we hear of the righteous who hope in the Lord and take delight in following His law. On the other hand we hear about the wicked who put their trust in human beings and not in God. We hear the righteous flourish and the wicked wither and die. What is the focus of your life? Ultimately you become what you focus upon. Do you focus on self-sufficiency and personal strength and success, or do you focus on living in the hope and trust of the Gospel. Luke in his Gospel is a master of reversal and we see it especially here in the Beatitudes. It is poverty that ultimately gives us a great treasure. What do you focus upon?

I am reminded of Bishop Malone's homily from Confirmation last year. He told a story of a group of young mothers of Kindergarten students on the first day of school. He said he was having coffee with them as he visited the school on the opening day. He said one mother spoke of big career plans and great university plans for her child. This sparked a few other moms to talk about the same big plans for their children.

Our Bishop mentioned there was one woman who was particularly quiet. Eventually she was asked about her hopes and plans for her children. She said that although she also hoped her children would be successful in education and career, her real hope was that they would be properly prepared for eternal life in Heaven. That was her real focus.

We all spend time on physical things, careers, education and community endeavors, and these are good things, but is that the focus of our life, or is the focus eternal life? We cannot do both with the same priority. One will be primary and the other secondary. If we focus on eternal life, we will most likely also be successful in a career and education, but ultimately we will not be trapped by physical things but find true joy in Jesus Christ our Savior. Many search for happiness all their life, but true joy is even better and is at our fingertips if only we focus upon it. What do you focus upon?

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.



### Respect Life

"Day of Mourning," Saturday, February 23: In opposition to 46 years of state-sanctioned killing of the unborn, Pro-Life leaders across the US are designating Saturday, February 23, as a "Day of Mourning." Organized events with speakers are taking place in cities nation-wide.

In New York, there will be a formal gathering in Albany from 1:00 - 3:00 pm at the Empire State Plaza Convention Center. Admission is free, but registration is required due to limited seating.

New Yorkers who can't attend in Albany are still asked to participate in some way that day, e.g. wear black, don't shop (limiting the collection of state taxes for that day), fast from food or some favored activity, and pray in reparation for the millions of lives lost through abortion.

With the passage of the Reproductive Health Act, the state of New York voted to expand abortion access right up to birth. Appallingly, this horrific act was celebrated with cheering and by lighting the One World Trade Center in pink. 


