From the Desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family,

I suppose we all have our little (or not so little) idiosyncrasies that make us unique. As you will all agree, I have several of these little traits - no comments from anyone please!!!

One of my little idiosyncrasies is that I actually read the instructions on "over the counter" medications. Thankfully, I do not often need an aspirin or cold medication, but if I do, I read the labels on the boxes and bottles. One common line that I see is something to the effect that if you use this product for more than seven days (or some number) consult your physician, as there may be a more serious problem. Let's take that thought to our current situation in the country and world.

On Monday night I was finally able to put away my Christmas decorations. I thought since it was Lent it was about time. As I worked on my project I had the evening news on the television. I rarely get to see the national news at 6:30pm. I watched the CBS national news and met there several students from Florida who have taken the tragedy they survived and have become activists for change. As you know, I have spent the majority of my life as a priest working with our youth and I take great joy in their enthusiasm and efforts. I applaud these young people who, in the midst of tragedy, are not idling in neutral, but forging forward for change. One very articulate young lady was calling for gun control laws and she stated that she knows that the issue is larger than that. I agree with her. I believe it was also the same young lady who said they have the right to life. Again, I agree! It was also stated by one of the young men that they have the right to go to school without worrying about being shot and that it is their job to be educated. Again, a true statement! I think the nation applauds and agrees with these teens.

On a different topic, how many more lower grade levels in elementary schools do we need to go before we realize we have a morality problem? It seems that each year the studies that I read reduce the age that our children, not teenagers or preteens, but children, are exposed to and developing addictions to internet pornography, and using cellular devices to put information about themselves or photographs of themselves into cyberspace. On yet another topic, how many more states and countries will need to legalize physician-assisted suicide before we realize we have a problem? It is interesting that the laws discussed are using "suicide" which is a term for intentional death. My list can go on and on, but I believe the point is made... if the condition goes on for more than seven days, consult your physician, as a more serious issue may exist: I believe a more serious issue exists and we need to consult The Physician.

Lent calls us to really consult "The Physician" our Triune God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The moral issues of sexuality and human life are in no way isolated issues. It appears we keep trying to treat each issue as isolated from the other. These issues tie together because a more serious issue does exist, which is a return to the understanding that we are sons and daughters of God. The issue is realizing that we are created and that our Creator has a right to give us instructions for life. Perhaps the reason why our culture has so many issues today is the fact that we have forgotten the fundamental definition of "who I am" resides in being a son or daughter of God. We have confused our identity. Too often today we identify ourselves with orientation, gender, pro-life, pro-choice and more... when the real identity is to see ourselves as a son or daughter of God. When we get to this deeper issue then we will be able to cure the many, many symptoms of confusion, division, violence and abuse which exist. Do you see that the deeper issue is to live each day knowing that you are a son or daughter of God? That is vour/our/mv identity and we need to return to that fundamental belief.

This Lent please reflect on the core of who you are and how you define yourself. If your answer is anything other than being a son or daughter of God or a member of the Body of Christ, I humbly request you to reconsider your definition of self. We not only need to do this for ourselves, but we also need to teach this to the next generation. This will treat the real problem and not simply medicate the symptoms.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

Respect Life

Immediate Action Needed!! Bishop Richard Malone urges everyone to speak out against pending legislation in New York that will further diminish the rights of the unborn.

"On January 16, 2018, Governor Cuomo introduced his budget bill, S.7511. In the bill, he included an abortion expansion proposal. **If the budget passes, virtually all limitations on abortion will be lifted.** This is particularly dangerous, because the law requires a budget to be passed by April 1. The Governor's bill would align New York with the most liberal abortion laws in the world.

• The bill would remove our current law's limit and allow abortions after 24 weeks, well after the point where a fetus can experience pain.

• 5-10% of babies are born alive after a late-term abortion procedure. This bill would eliminate the law that requires that a baby born alive after an abortion be given adequate health care.

• This bill would permit non-doctors to do abortions – the state government could grant a license to perform abortions to anyone.


• The bill would eliminate all criminal penalties for abortions—if an abortion was against a mother's will (involuntary or coerced), or if an unborn child is deliberately targeted for an act of violence, it could not be prosecuted.

Despite more and more states enacting sensible limitations on abortions, New York State is doing the opposite. <u>Please</u> reach out to your State Senator to oppose this bill and encourage your family and friends to do the same.
