<u>Questions and Answers About This</u> <u>Week's Healing Mission</u>

1. Are the 12:00 noon and 7:00pm services the same?

Yes, they are. You can choose the one that bests suits you and your family.

2. How long does each service last?

About an hour and a half. It consists of the celebration of the Eucharist with a 20-minute homily or teaching. After Mass people have the opportunity to come forward for individual prayer for healing with a priest or deacon. Confession will be available at this time as well.

3. Can I come to just one of the sessions?

You can, however the theme of the threesession Mission is cumulative and each session builds on the previous message. You will still certainly profit even if you do not attend all three sessions.

4. What is the theme of the Healing Mission?

The theme is the healing of all that is not right. It's about physical healing, emotional healing, moral healing, financial healing, etc. Our particular topic this time is on Healing of Relationships. The Mission will help you to know why you should heal relationships and how to do it.

Diocese of Buffalo Press Release on Compensation Program for victims of sexual abuse

Last week, Bishop Malone and the Diocese of Buffalo announced a new compensation program for victims of sexual abuse. Below is the press release in its entirety.

Diocese announces Compensation Program for victims of sexual abuse

Bishop Richard J. Malone has announced the establishment of a voluntary Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) for those who have made claims that they were sexually abused as a child by a member of the clergy in the Diocese of Buffalo. Individuals who have previously made claims will be contacted and invited to participate in this voluntary program offering monetary settlements.

"I know this is the right thing to do," said Bishop Malone. "The victims and our Church in Western New York cannot move forward until the pain of the past is properly addressed. Over the past year, several other dioceses have launched similar programs and it was well-received and appreciated by many of those victims as a form of healing. We pray that this monetary compensation together with the acknowledgment that they were hurt can be a significant step in helping them to heal. If we can help victims to heal, then we as a Church can begin to heal from this awful part of our past."

The program will be administered by former New York State Supreme Court Justice Jerome Gorski and former New York State Supreme Court Justice and former Surrogate Judge Barbara Howe. Justice Gorski (ret.) is an arbitrator and mediator with National Arbitration and Mediation. Justice Howe (ret.) is Senior Counsel to the law firm Woods Oviatt Gilman LLP. The administrators will determine the appropriate compensation to be offered each claimant whose claim is accepted. The claimant will have 60 days to accept or reject the settlement. The Diocese does not have the authority to modify or reject any individual claim determination made by the administrators.

"This program is a next step to continue the Diocese's ongoing commitment to protect children and help victims. In many cases, the Diocese has provided a pastoral response, counseling and other assistance as needed to victims," said Terrence M. Connors, of Connors LLP. "The Diocese of Buffalo prepared a written policy in 1990 to address the issue. This policy was distributed to all Diocesan clergy twelve years before the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops approved a revised Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People in 2002 to ensure the Church's vigilance in guarding against violations of trust."

Since 2003, the Diocese has been conducting mandatory training and a system of background checks for all who regularly interact with young people. Using a program called Virtus , www.Virtus.org, entitled 'Protecting God's Children', every cleric, church employee and volunteer initially goes through hours of training, and then, every month, they are also required to read additional training materials and answer questions pertaining to new trends in the way predators are targeting young victims.

Diocesan clergy, employees and volunteers are not only trained to identify signs of sexual abuse, but are also required to report suspected abuse to the Victim Assistance Coordinator and to the District Attorney's office as well. In the Diocese of Buffalo, Victim Assistance Coordinator, Jacqueline Joy, is experienced in trauma therapy. She facilitates diocesan assistance for victims and their families. In this regard, the Catholic Church has a proactive policy and will continue to protect the rights of all people, with a special concern for the vulnerable.

This new IRCP will be paid from self-insurance liability and investment fund reserves. The donations made to the recently completed *Upon This Rock* campaign or the ongoing *Catholic Charities* campaign will not be used for this program. Respect Life

Hawaii Close to Legalizing Assisted Suicide (from womenofgrace.com): Two House committees in the Hawaii state legislature voted to legalize medical aid in dying for terminally ill adults. The bill will be voted on by the full House and then on to the Senate where a similar bill was passed with overwhelming support last year.

Hawaii Governor David Ige has signaled that he intends to sign the bill into law if it reaches his desk.

Lawmakers claim this bill is one of the toughest assisted suicide bills in the nation by requiring a prognosis of six months or less to live due to a terminal illness. The patient must be mentally capable of deciding and have one counseling session with a qualified person. A written request must be witnessed by two people with one not related to the patient, and the patient must self-administer the lethal drugs. It also calls for a 48-hour waiting period between the written request and the filling of the prescription.

According to the teachings of the Church, the taking of human life, even for the purposes of ending suffering, is **never** permissible. From the USCCB:

"A law or court decision allowing assisted suicide would demean the lives of vulnerable patients and expose them to exploitation by those who feel they are better off dead. The voiceless or marginalized in our society — the poor, the frail elderly, racial minorities, millions of people who lack health insurance — would be the first to feel pressure to die.

As responsible stewards of life, we must never directly intend to cause our own death or that of anyone else. Euthanasia and assisted suicide are always gravely wrong."

A bill to legalize physician-assisted suicide is currently moving through the Massachusetts state legislature as well. To date, similar bills introduced in New York have been defeated in the State Senate.
