### From the Desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family,

As we celebrate this weekend, I have a few things to share.

First, congratulations to Irma Narduzzo who received the St. Joseph the Worker Award on Sunday, March 11, at St. Joseph Cathedral. This is one of the highest awards for the laity of our Diocese to receive from our Bishop. A parish may nominate a parishioner only once every three years for this honor. This award high-lights a person who has dedicated themselves, much like St. Joseph, to a life of quiet, prayerful, diligent work for their parish. Irma has dedicated a substantial part of her life to St. Gregory the Great Parish. Irma, along with her late husband, Aldo, came to St. Gregory's in 1958. They raised their family here and Irma has been blessed to also see her grandchildren raised at St. Gregory's. Over the years, Irma has probably been a part of everything at St. Gregory's. Among her many current works, Irma is an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist at Mass, a Minister of the Eucharist to the Sick, a Sacristan and an Adult Server both at the weekday Masses and for funerals. She also works on preparing our parish mailings, is part of Mission, and you have seen Irma pouring coffee and ladling punch at virtually every parish reception. Above all of this, Irma has always supported every endeavor and priest at St. Gregory's in furthering the mission of the Church. We congratulate you, Irma, on this well-deserved honor from our Bishop, and we thank you for all you have done for St. Gregory the Great Parish!

Next, I also wish to congratulate Nicholas (Nick) Perry who, on Saturday, March 17, received the Altar Server of the Year Award from Bishop Richard Malone at St. Joseph's Cathedral. Nick is a junior at Clarence High School and continues to serve as an acolyte at Mass and is waiting to be trained as a Eucharistic Minister. He is also a faithful member of our "Rodzinka" group for High-School guys. This group meets once a month for an evening of prayer, faith sharing and apologetic studies and reflection. This annual award recognizes one young person from each parish for their exemplary service, faithfulness, reverence and consistent dedication as an altar server. It is awesome to note that, as a junior in High School, Nick is still willing to take a leadership role as a server at Mass. He has recently been inducted to the National Honor Society at Clarence High School as well. We honor "scholar-athletes" in High School and Nick would fit that bill for sure, but today we congratulate a well-rounded young man who is not only a "scholar athlete," but also a faith-filled and dedicated Son of our Lord Jesus Christ. (continued from page 1) Next, this weekend we have the privilege of welcoming Mr. Robert Bennett to our parish. We all know the name "Bob Bennett" in Western New York. In the most recent couple decades Bob's name was and is still known in education circles as a great leader, member of the New York State Board of Regents, and a past Chancellor of Education for the State of New York. Prior to this chapter of his life, Bob's name was most well known as the leader of the United Way in Buffalo. Through Bob's entire life, his name has been known as a faithful member of the Church, a daily communicant and leader in the Diocese of Buffalo. This year Bob is the Chair for the 2018 Catholic Charities Appeal. Bob has a passion for all of the works of mercy that flow from our financial generosity to fund all that Catholic Charities accomplishes in Western New York. Catholic Charities really is the leader in our community for social services, adoption, foster care, service corps, chemical dependence counseling, counseling for families and individuals, emergency aid, direct aid for refugees and services in healthcare, military programs and much more. Welcome, Bob, and thank you for being a great Catholic leader for our Church and State of New York!

Our St. Gregory the Great Parish goal for Catholic Charities this year is \$692, 989. I am very thankful to everyone who has already given and I humbly ask you to consider giving this year if you have not made your gift. Only about one-third of the registered parishioners of St. Gregory's are donors. Last year, 1,866 registered households of St. Gregory's 6,000 families donated to Catholic Charities. Each year we see, as does every parish in the Diocese, a decline in the number of donors. At the same time the declining number of donors seems to give more and more. Thank you for all you have done and will do this year.

Finally, and not least in any way, this week we saw the efforts of our teenagers who staged across the country a "walk out" of school on Wednesday to commemorate the tragic school shooting in Florida one month ago. We applaud these young activists who have "had enough" of school violence. They are correct – it is enough! As I have written before, this is only one symptom of a larger problem, that the culture of Relativism is a culture of death. The culture of death is being furthered at this time both in Albany and in Washington. Both our state and national leaders in different ways are considering legislation to expand abortion, taxpayer funding of abortion, limitation of physician's rights and businesses' objection to provision under conscience in healthcare provisions. Just as our young activists "walked out" and also prayed on Wednesday in schools across the country, may we follow their example and call, e-mail and write to all of our elected State and National officials to respect human life and defeat this effort to expand abortion and to stop using our tax dollars to fund the culture of death that spreads from the womb to the classroom to church shootings to concerts in the park and daily on our city streets. It all ties together – we need to support life and do something about it like our youth did this past week.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

**Bishops Support Conscience Protection Act** (from usccb.org): Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan of New York, chair of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Pro-Life Ac-

tivities, and Archbishop Joseph E. Kurtz of Louisville, chair of the USCCB's Committee for Religious Liberty, urge the faithful to flood Congress with emails and calls asking for enactment of the Conscience Protection Act (CPA) as part of the 2018 funding bill.

Congress is currently considering whether to include the CPA in must-pass government funding legislation. A decision on its inclusion will be made prior to <u>March 23</u>.

The Bishops' statement:

"Increasing and fierce attacks on conscience rights regarding abortion cry out for an immediate remedy. Nurses and other health care providers and institutions are being forced to choose between participating in abortions or leaving health care altogether. Churches and pro-life Americans are being forced to provide coverage for elective abortions—including late-term abortions—in their health care plans. Opponents and supporters of abortion should be able to agree that no one should be forced to participate in abortion. Congress must remedy this problem by enacting the Conscience Protection Act now as part of the FY 2018 funding bill.

"We call on all the faithful to pray and to act by emailing and calling Congress in the coming weeks with the message that enacting the Conscience Protection Act is urgently needed to protect Americans from being forced to violate their deeply held convictions about respect for human life. Your calls and emails to your Members of Congress really do make a difference, so please act now to protect conscience rights!"
