From the Desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family, as you know, the Diocese of Buffalo has been the lead story in The News for a few weeks now. We need to pray daily for our good Bishop, Bishop Malone, as he shepherds us through this crisis. We need to certainly pray for anyone who has been abused by anyone, but especially by a trusted member of the clergy. We need to pray for those who have injured others; we pray for their healing and reconciliation. We also pray for an understanding that we are dealing with a very human problem that affects many facets of our communities, from public and private schools to athletic leagues and even within family relationships. This very human problem, a societal problem, has also touched our Church. The Church is part of society. We have a divine founder and purpose, but where there are human beings, there will be problems. We should expect the highest from our clergy, but we also must remember the humanity involved. May we not lose sight of that in these difficult times. We are dealing with a human issue that has also affected our Church and we are not dealing with a specific issue that is only within the Church.

Having stated the above, it is important not to let the headline news eclipse the central mysteries of our faith. Today we begin the most solemn week of our Church year and probably the most important time to be together as a parish family. The liturgical events of Holy Week, and most significantly those of the Sacred Triduum, define who we are as the Body of Christ and give meaning, purpose and identity to our life as a parish community.

As we celebrate this Palm Sunday we again begin with the joy and triumph of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, and move to the solemn reality of His Passion and Death as we read the Passion Narrative. We are called to identify the joy in our life and triumph as we see the areas of our lives that are fulfilled because we have joined our life to Christ and not to the secular world. Our call as the Body of Christ in the world today is to continually "die to self" in order to "rise with Christ" and live in His joy, triumph and light. Although there is an emotional dimension to our faith, our joy and triumph is not emotional, but rooted in conviction of mind, heart and soul. Our faith is not a passing emotion, but the decision to love Jesus Christ and to serve Him by serving others in His name. (cont'd on page 2)

(cont'd from page 1) On Holy Tuesday we celebrate the Chrism Mass at 7:00pm at St. Joseph Cathedral on Franklin Street in Downtown Buffalo. All are welcome to come to this joyous Mass where all the Priests of the Diocese gather with Bishop Malone and renew our priestly promises of Ordination. It is also the Mass where our Bishop will bless the Holy Oils to be used in this coming year. He will bless the Oil of the Catechumenate for those to be Baptized, the Oil of Sacred Chrism for those to be Baptized or Confirmed or to be Ordained a Priest, and the Oil of the Sick for the anointing of those in need of healing or are near life's end. This is an awesome celebration filled with great prayer, hope and joy.

Holy Thursday we celebrate the 7:00pm Mass of the Lord's Supper which begins really one liturgy that spans three days. In this first part we mark the institution of the Eucharist and Priesthood by Jesus, as well as our call to serve in His name. This call is made real to us as we recall Jesus' washing of His apostles' feet and relive that call as the priests will wash the feet of twelve parishioners.

Good Friday is the second part of this three-day celebration. This is the most solemn day of the liturgical year. We will celebrate the Seven Last Words of Christ at 12:00noon and the traditional Good Friday Passion Service at 3:00pm. On Good Friday night our teenagers will act out the Stations of the Cross in Church at 7:00pm. We will reflect on our call to die with Christ in the world today.

Finally, Holy Saturday is the Great Easter Vigil – the highlight and final part of our three-day liturgy. We begin in darkness and bless the new fire and the new Paschal Candle. The Light of Christ is brought into the Church for all to share and in just moments the Church is glowing with each of our individual candles burning as we receive the Light of Christ from the Paschal Candle. Please come to listen to the story of salvation, to witness Christ's Resurrection, and joyfully celebrate with our Brothers and Sisters who will be Baptized, received into the Church, Confirmed and receive Holy Communion for the first time. This year's Vigil will begin at 7:00pm with our hope that many more will come to celebrate this central element of our faith.

I urge you to really make this week "Holy." Use this week for simplicity in diet, entertainment and life in general. Allow yourself the luxury of quiet. Perhaps turn off the cell phone and cancel nonessential activities in order to better focus on the Sacred Triduum. Be willing to join your life more intimately with Christ's life and emerge with a better experience and understanding of the meaning of Easter and our relationship with Jesus.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

Immediate Action Needed!! Bishop Richard Malone urges everyone to speak out against pending legislation in New York that will further diminish the rights of the unborn.

"On January 16, 2018, Governor Cuomo introduced his budget bill, S.7511. In the bill, he included an abortion expansion proposal. **If the budget passes, virtually all limitations on abortion will be lifted.** This is particularly dangerous, because the law requires a budget to be passed by April 1.

The Governor's bill would align New York with the most liberal abortion laws in the world.

• The bill would remove our current law's limit and allow abortions after 24 weeks, well after the point where a fetus can experience pain.

• 5-10% of babies are born alive after a late-term abortion procedure. This bill would eliminate the law that requires that a baby born alive after an abortion be given adequate health care.

• This bill would permit non-doctors to do abortions – the state government could grant a license to perform abortions to anyone.

• The bill would eliminate all criminal penalties for abortions –if an abortion was against a mother's will (involuntary or coerced), or if an unborn child is deliberately targeted for an act of violence, it could not be prosecuted.

Despite more and more states enacting sensible limitations on abortions, New York State is doing the opposite. <u>*Please*</u> *reach out to your State Senator to oppose this bill* and encourage your family and friends to do the same.
