From the Desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family, this week we welcome our Ordinary, Most Reverend Richard J. Malone, to St. Gregory the Great to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation for our teenagers on Tuesday and Thursday evenings at 7:00pm. I invite and urge you to come to celebrate Mass with us either or both of these evenings, as this is a major celebration of our community. It is a time for the entire parish to come and celebrate with our teens and their families. This is not a private celebration of Confirmation, but a gathering of the community.

Having the Sacrament of Confirmation this week, along with reflection on the daily Mass readings from the Acts of the Apostles, calls us to the meaning of "community." We would do well as a Church and as a parish community to reflect on the actual nature and meaning of "community." Today we often want to "create" communities or "build" communities. These terms and many workshops I have attended on this subject concern me because it leads one to conclude that a community is manufactured or engineered in some way. I believe that a community, although requiring hard work, is something that forms when a group of people with a common purpose and goal band together. A community is not engineered, but is a gathering of individuals with like mind, purpose and conviction to accomplish that purpose.

I think back to 1958 when St. Gregory the Great Parish was formed. It was the beginning of transforming farmland into what we now know as the largest suburb of Buffalo. Many people moved out from "the city" to live and form "the suburb" of Amherst. Many houses were built and many businesses naturally followed. A community was formed at 200 St. Gregory Court under the name and patronage of "St. Gregory the Great." Why? I believe the answer is simple. Many of those who moved out here were Catholic. They came from various other city neighborhoods, and even different cities, to work, as Buffalo was thriving. Since they possessed the like belief and practice in the Catholic Faith, they formed a parish and school to worship God in the Catholic tradition and to have a place dedicated to passing on the Faith to their children and following generations. I do not believe that someone at the Chancery office engineered a Church to be planted here in order to develop homes for a community to begin. The people came, had like belief, and the Diocese of Buffalo and the people realized a community was forming and a parish needed to be erected.

I think back to 1907 when my Grandfather came to Buffalo and settled in Black Rock. He bought a home and began a tailor shop and dry cleaning business. He was one of many Polish immigrants who came from the same region of Poland to seek a better life in the United States. (continued on page 2)

People from one region of Poland formed the community of Black Rock and other Polish people from other regions formed communities in other areas of Buffalo, including the East Side, Kaisertown and more. They formed a neighborhood to live together as they had a shared bond from the "old world" and they formed Churches to worship God and to pass on the Faith to their children. No one engineered or planned for this to happen other than God.

What is the community of St. Gregory's today? This week 139 of our teenagers will become full members of the community of the Catholic Church at St. Gregory's. What exactly does this mean? Are we an intentional community of believers or a community of convenience? Honestly, there are a number of our teenagers who have chosen to be confirmed elsewhere for various reasons probably including convenience. Today we see people come and go from parishes for various reasons including the services the parish may offer (a consumer mentality), who is the pastor (personality and popularity), what subjects are preached about, and more. The Catholic Church has always had the Eucharist as the center of the Church and each parish community. Is the celebration of the Eucharist the real center of our community? I know that I see it as such. Is that where the 6,000 plus registered households are at St. Gregory's, and in any parish in the Diocese? A question to ponder! Bishop Malone is requiring all parishes to examine Mass attendance and will have non-parishioners count the number of people assembled to worship at every Mass for the next three weeks. The Eucharist is the central moment for the community to gather and needs to be celebrated with our full participation and a full congregation with parishioners focused on contributing their time, talent and treasure to allow the Mass to be the "source and summit of our faith" (Second Vatican Council). Is that what we search for and the purpose of our gathering? For me it is, and I hope the same is true for all.

Please take some time to reflect on the meaning of community and the importance of our parish community. Please take time to reflect on the intentional nature of our Catholic Parish rather than the conveniences we have or search for regarding our faith lives. Please pray for our teenagers who will become fully initiated members of the community and please come to be a community with them on Tuesday and Thursday at 7:00pm to pray with and for our brothers and sisters in Christ with our Bishop presiding at the Eucharist.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

Diocesan Task Force on the Study of Liturgies

Bishop Malone and his Presbyteral Council are currently looking into ways to promote both the spiritual welfare of priests and the liturgical life of each parish. They are particularly concerned about the number and quality of Masses celebrated at each parish. With a declining number of priests, we should not expect priests to celebrate more liturgies on a weekend than are needed; and, fewer Masses with larger attendance would encourage more-vibrant celebrations of the Eucharist.

The Bishop is asking all parishes to engage in a collaborate effort to look at Mass schedules and Mass attendance. This will be coordinated at the Vicariate level with suggestions to be sent to a Diocesan Task Force that has been established by the Bishop. Engagement in this process at the parish level will be vital in creating a revised and coordinated Vicariate Mass schedule that will promote the physical and spiritual well-being of priests as well as provide quality liturgical celebrations in each parish.



Crucial Victory in Fight Against the HHS Mandate: On March 28, a federal judge ruled in favor of the Catholic Benefits Association(CBA), issuing a <u>permanent</u> injunction and declaratory relief against the Department of Health and Human Services' contraception mandate.

The CBA represents more than 1,000 Catholic employers. More than 88,000 people work for companies that are part of the CBA.

In 2014, the CBA filed two federal lawsuits against the HHS mandate which required all insurance plans to cover contraception, sterilization procedures, and emergency contraception. The CBA argued that this mandate ...was forcing Catholic employers to violate their deeply-held religious beliefs. U.S. District Court Judge David Russell agreed. [His] injunction will prevent the federal government from enforcing the mandate. Russell also ruled that this mandate [violated] the Religious Freedom Restoration Act by attempting to force employers to provide contraception and sterilization, [infringing upon] their sincerely held religious beliefs.

Failure to comply with the mandate meant that businesses were subject to fines. The companies that make up the CBA had collectively accrued \$6.9 billion in fines, which were eliminated with the ruling. Companies that are not part of the CBA are still subject to the mandate, which remains in place as-is.

CBA CEO Douglas G. Wilson, Jr. said the association was "most grateful" by the decision, [and] ...that Russell's ruling is an "important judicial validation of religious liberty" in the context of the First Amendment and of the Religious Freedom Restoration Act. Wilson believes that this will pave the way for other religious groups to protect themselves against the mandate.

"His ruling creates a precedent which, we are sure, will be cited by religious faiths across America in their own resistance to these immoral intrusions." (From catholicnewsagency.com)
