



Planning Your Lesson

You are provided with many tools to help you become a successful catechist. You will have a Catechist Manual and a prepared lesson plan for each session. The Catechist Manual will provide background materials to help you grow in your faith, an outline of the lesson, key religious vocabulary words and definitions that are used in the lesson, a Catechism reference, prayer suggestions and a webpage to go to for additional help.

Don't know an answer? Be honest. If you do not know the answer to a question, admit it and tell your class that you will find the answer by the next session.

Create a warm and welcoming atmosphere by arriving early to welcome your learners, getting to know them by name, disciplining with respect and providing them with positive praise and reinforcement.

Family Faith Formation



Catechesis is derived from a Greek term which means "to echo."
As a catechist you echo the Word of God.

A Family Faith Formation Catechist at St. Gregory's must attest to the fact that they have received the Sacrament of Confirmation, attend Mass and receive Holy Communion regularly, that any school-aged members of their family are under religious instructions, and if married, they have entered a ceremony performed in conformity with the regulations of the Catholic Church. They must promise to teach in accordance to the teachings of the Catholic Church and to give example and encouragement by their Catholic lifestyle to the students they instruct.

Catechetical Terms

Catechesis: a process of handing on our Catholic faith.

Catechist: a teacher, one who instructs others in the faith.

Session : a lesson or class.

As a catechist you have the opportunity to:

- Share your knowledge of the Bible
- Give back to God what you have received from God
- Help children learn to pray and become closer to God
- Help them realize the presence of God in their lives and instill values, direction and Christian principles to help them make good moral decisions for the rest of their lives.

Tasks of Catechesis

- To promote knowledge of the faith.
- To promote knowledge of the meaning of the Liturgy and the sacraments.
- To promote moral formation in Jesus Christ.
- To teach the Christian how to pray with Christ.
- To prepare the Christian to live in community and to participate actively in the life and mission of the Church.
- To promote a missionary spirit that prepares the faithful to be present as Christians in society.
