

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

My Dear Parish Family,

We are finally in the heart of Ordinary time. Even though Ordinary Time began in the Church after Pentecost, our Sundays have been focused on very key parts of our Faith, like the Trinity, and the Body and Blood of Christ. This Sunday we celebrate the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time and we are called to "not look back."

I recall a 1976 movie, **The Gumball Rally**, a film featuring an eclectic group of people taking part in a secret and illegal, cross country road race. I recall in the beginning of the race one of the drivers tore off the rear view mirror from the windshield and threw it out the window. The other person in the car asked him why he did that and he replied, "What is behind us is not important.." That is a great image and question for us to ponder. Do you spend more time looking in the rear view mirror at past mistakes, missed opportunities, sins or even great moments of success, rather than looking through the windshield of life at what is yet to come? I fear many spend far too much time in the rear view mirror which keeps us from moving forward.

The rear view mirror can be one large reason we do not move forward in the life of Faith or generally in life. Similarly, we may be more consumed with things that we need to take care of first before we follow Jesus. In today's Gospel, Jesus may appear harsh telling the man who wishes to bury his Father first, "Let the dead bury their dead." I do not believe that the man was in the middle of a wake or funeral when Jesus spoke these words.

We do not know from the passage if the man's Father had even passed away. Jesus was calling him to the immediacy of the Gospel and the immediacy of addressing the Kingdom of God. All too often we get absorbed in the other things, that we place the Gospel and the Kingdom of God in the back seat of the car. These things may be good and necessary, like caring for a loved one who is ill, raising a family, or getting a degree from school and more. The message today is a simple one: have you allowed something or someone to become more important than the Gospel or the Kingdom of God? If so, you need to take time to reflect on your Discipleship.

Jesus' call is to place Him first. Do not look in the rear view mirror, be in the now! I believe that Jesus wants us to be like Elisha in 1 Kings:19. This Sunday's first reading reminds us not to be immediate. Elisha leaves everything behind immediately. Not only does he leave it behind, he takes it apart as he dismantles his old life of farming. Elisha has nothing in his rear view mirror. Elisha leaves nothing behind to even tempt him to go back to an old way of life.

Why must we leave our old ways behind? Why should we let go of the rear view mirror? FREE-**DOM** – that is why! St. Paul tells the Galatians in the second reading to be free. This week we celebrate Independence Day – Freedom. We remember the framers of our Constitution and those who signed the Declaration of Independence as well as those who fought not only the Revolutionary War, but all those who have fought for our freedom since 1776. The meaning of true freedom is a constant question for our Nation and our Faith. We are often reminded by great patriots of our nation that "Freedom isn't free." We are reminded by great saints of our Church that "Freedom isn't free." May great men and women have died for our wonderful Nation and many great men and women, saints, have died a martyr's death for living our Faith.

Today, in our culture, there are different understandings of freedom. Some would say freedom means I can do anything I wish while others believe that freedom has parameters and isn't reckless behavior. What does freedom mean to you both civically and spiritually? Maybe take today's reading from Paul's letter to the Galatians and re-read it and pray over it to understand freedom. Does your definition of freedom equate to God's or is it different?

Finally, next weekend, July 6th & 7th, we welcome, His Excellency, Archbishop Fortunatus Nwachukwu, Titular Archbishop of Acquaviva and the Apostolic Nuncio of the Antilles Episcopal Conference. He was first ordained a priest on June 17, 1984 and served in the Diocese of Aba (Nigeria). He has served in Holy See Embassies in Ghana, Paraguay, Algeria, at the UN offices and Specialized Institutions in Geneva, and at the Secretariat of State at the Vatican. Between 2007 and 2012 he was the Chief of Protocol of the Secretariat of State (Vatican). first assignment as Head of Mission was on November 12, 2012 as Apostolic Nuncio in Nicaragua. His Excellency will preach at all of the Masses on the work of the Missions. We will also take our annual mission appeal collection next weekend at all of the Masses to support the Church's missionary work. We welcome ArchBishop Fortunatus Nwachukwu to St. Gregory the Great. It is an honor for us to welcome an esteemed leader of our universal church.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.



THE LIFE-CHANGING MES-SAGE OF DIVINE MERCY

Completely Trust in Jesus

Our Lord wants us to know that the graces of His mercy can only be received if we trust. Jesus repeatedly reminded St. Faustina of this: **The graces of My mercy are**

drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is – trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive (Diary, 1578). Sooner would heaven and earth turn into nothingness than would My mercy not embrace a trusting soul (1777).

There is more to trust than just believing that God is trustworthy. Trust is a living faith. By trusting we agree to not dwell on the past or fear the future. We entrust our entire existence to the providence of God. This means that we agree that God can write the script of our lives instead of insisting on our own script. We agree with the pledge we make in the Our Father: "Your will (not mine) be done" (DMM 31.) When we ask with complete trust Jesus fills us with grace so we can be merciful as our Heavenly Father is merciful. When a soul approaches Me with trust, I fill it with an abundance of graces that it cannot contain them within itself, but radiates them to other souls (1074).







RESPECT LIFE

"Male and Female He Created Them": On

June 10, the Congregation for Catholic Education issued an extensive document denouncing so-called gender theory, and affirmed the principles of human dignity, difference, and complementarity. The document titled, "Male and Female He Created Them," is written for Catholic schools as well as Christians working in other educational settings, for parents and students, and for the clergy.

The document states that the Church teaches an essential difference between men and woman, ordered in the natural law and essential to the family and human flourishing. "There is a need to refute attempts to negate the male-female duality of human nature, from which the family is generated ... The denial of this duality not only erases the vision of human beings as the fruit of an act of creation but creates the idea of the human person as a sort of abstraction who 'chooses for himself what his nature is to be.""

"[The focus of] gender theory has expanded... to the possibility of ...individuals determining [their] own sexual tendencies without having to take account of the reciprocity and complementarity of male-female relationships, nor of the procreative end of sexuality. [This results in] a 'radical separation between gender and sex, with the former having priority over the later' and [consequently the] ...undermining of the family. "[In gender theory] the only thing that matters in personal relationships is the affection between the individuals involved, irrespective of sexual difference or procreation which would be seen as irrelevant in the formation of families."

For Christians working in schools, both religious and secular, the radical individualism of gender theory should be avoided in favor of teaching children "to overcome their individualism and discover, in the light of faith, their specific vocation to live responsibly in a community." 


