From the desk of the Pastor

My Dear Parish family, WELCOME HOME! I believe our Church looks beautiful! Although there is a punch list of items to complete, all of the major work is accomplished. I am most grateful to God for a timely job well done! Thank you again to all who donated, to all who served on committees, to our Parish Staff who stepped up in many, many ways. Thank you one and all for your patience as we celebrated our Faith in the Ministry Center.

It is hard to believe that it is Palm Sunday and Holy Week! Just a few short weeks ago, we began our Lenten journey with Ashes on our foreheads and intentions of prayer, charity and fasting. How has Lent been for you?

If you have had a Faithful and Faith-filled Lent – awesome! If you have had a "roller coaster" Lent of spiritual highs and lows; that is good. Our Good Lord fell three times carrying the cross and sometimes we fall too. I often wonder why Jesus fell three times. Some believe it was the weight of our sins.

The Adoration Chapel will be closed from Holy Thursday, April 18, at 9:00 am through Easter Monday, April 22, at 8:30 am. We wish all of you a happy and blessed Easter.

PARISH OFFICE CLOSED

All Parish Offices will be closed from **Good Friday**, **April 19**, **through Easter Monday**, **April 22**. We will reopen on Tuesday, April 23. There will be only one Mass only on Monday, April 22, at 8:00 am.

Although that is true; I often wonder if Jesus was trying to teach us that in our humanity we will fall, but also in humanity, as we rely upon the divine, we must also pick ourselves up and continue onward. If your Lent has been filled with ups and downs, perhaps try to enter into a reflection on the Stations of the Cross in particular, a reflection on the three times Jesus fell and picked himself up again. Finally, if Lent never took off for you, or if it quickly was extinguished, use this week to pick yourself up and move forward to experience the final few days as well as the time of our Sacred Triduum.

As we enter this Holy Week, please try to follow the rhythm of the Church and experience the highs and lows of the sacred mysteries. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday are still days of Lent. Try to remain faithful, or, if your Lent has been difficult, perhaps begin to live the Lenten disciplines of fasting, prayer and charity. On Holy Tuesday, April 16, at 7:00 pm is the Chrism Mass at St. Joseph's Cathedral. Try and come to this Diocesan celebration. At this Mass, all the priests of the Diocese are invited to concelebrate and renew their commitment of Ordination. Also, the Oil of the Sick, the Oil of the Catechumens and the Oil of Chrism are blessed by the Bishop to be used throughout the Diocese for the celebration of the sacraments throughout the year . If you are going to be Confirmed this year, the Bishop will consecrate the Oil of Chrism which is used here at St. Greg's on May 14 and 16 for the celebration of Confirmation. If you see a Baptism in the next year, the same Oil of Chrism is used at every Baptism as well as, the Oil of the Catechumens (also called Oil of the Saints). Please come to this beautiful Mass and celebrate of the Sacramental life of our Church.

Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday form the Sacred Triduum. On Holy Thursday come to the 7:00 pm celebration of the Lord's Supper which concludes with a Eucharistic procession to our repository set up in the Gathering Rooms. Come and pray with Jesus for an hour as we mark the time He spent in the Garden of Gethsemane, or participate in the Seven Churches Pilgrimage. Good Friday we have a few celebrations to assist us in reflecting on the Cross and Death of Christ. The Great Easter Vigil on Saturday at 7:00 pm marks the time of "Vigil" as we wait for and begin to celebrate the Resurrection. At the Easter Vigil those among us preparing for full initiation into our Church will be Baptized, fully professed, Confirmed and receive the Eucharist with us for the first time. We will also celebrate Easter Masses at 8:00 am; 9:30 am, 11:00 am and 12:30 pm. Please note there will be no 4:30 pm Mass on Easter Sunday.

Finally, please remember that from the end of the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper, until the Great Easter Vigil, we are in a solemn time. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. This means that we may take food three times during the day, but two of the three times are to be very small and simple portion of food, and one time during the day we may have one simple meal. Abstinence means that we do not eat meat on Good Friday.

I wish you a prayerful experience of Holy Week. Please pray for me as I will pray for you. May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.





RESPECT LIFE

Pope Francis Comments on Artificial Intelligence: In February, Pope Francis

addressed the membership of the Pontifical Academy for Life regarding Artificial Intelligence (AI). He raised concerns regarding how technology is contributing to the devaluing of human life and reason. He exhorted the Academy to devote the next two years to studying the issue and to provide a valuable Christian perspective for researchers.

"We know the difficulties with which our world struggles...[On] one hand, technological development has allowed us to solve problems that were insurmountable until a few years ago, ...However, today's evolution of technical capacity casts a dangerous spell: instead of delivering the tools that improve their care to human life, there is the risk of giving life to the logic of the devices that decide its value.

It is important to reiterate: 'Artificial intelligence' robotics and other technological innovations must be so employed that they contribute to the service of humanity and to the protection of our common home... The inherent dignity of every human being must be firmly placed at the center of our reflection and action. In this regard, it should be noted that the designation of 'artificial intelligence' may [be] misleading. The terms conceal the fact that - [despite] the useful fulfilment of servile tasks, functional automatisms remain qualitatively distant from the human prerogatives of knowledge and action. And therefore, they can become socially dangerous. Moreover, the risk of man being 'technologized', rather than technology humanized, is already real: so-called 'intelligent machines' are hastily attributed capacities that are properly human. Indeed, artificial devices that simulate human capabilities are devoid of human quality. This must be [considered] to guide the regulation of their use, and research itself, towards a constructive and equitable interaction between human beings and the latest versions of machines."


