

#### From the desk of the Pastor

My Dear Parish Family, As we celebrate this Second Sunday of Easter, known to us as Divine Mercy Sunday, we bring to a close the Octave of Easter and move into the Easter Season. Even though Lent has ended, it is important to still remember all of our Lenten promises, especially those we took on to improve our personal or spiritual life. The real goal of Lent is to make some characteristic changes in our way of living. This Sunday it is important to remember that we still focus on the Resurrection of Jesus and walk with the apostles and early disciples as they experience our Risen Savior and try to understand. This Sunday it is important that we reflect on God's Mercy as we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This Sunday we reflect on Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska and her writings in her Diary, Divine Mercy in My Soul.

Do you believe God to be an "Ocean of Mercy" or do you fear God as filled with wrath and revenge or see Him as someone who needs to be pleased in order to love you? This is the primary question which must be answered. How do you relate to God and what is your image of Him? I pray that your image of God is that of a loving, forgiving, merciful and abundantly generous God. This weekend we meet "doubting Thomas" in the Gospel reading.

Our Divine Mercy celebration will be held, today, Sunday April 28, from 2:00-3:00 pm in the Church. A reception of delicious food will be hosted, by the Ladies of the Lord, immediately following the celebration. Jesus told St. Faustina

ately following the celebration. Jesus told St. Faustina that those who go to confession and receive Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and remission of punishment. Pope John Paul II, called Divine Mercy, "a great gift and splendor for the church." Please join us.

I suppose it is easy to understand why Thomas doubted. He came to the upper room and heard "hard to believe" information. Maybe we are a little like Thomas. Maybe we doubt God's mercy. Of course our doubting God's mercy cannot limit God's mercy. God's mercy in infinite! Sometimes God's mercy is the most difficult thing to understand in faith. Perhaps we find it hard to understand how God can still show mercy even when we are broken and intentionally sin and turn away from Him. Doubt is a real thing. Have you ever doubted to the point that it has held you back from fully believing in God and His Divine Mercy?

The English word "mercy" or the French word "merci" or the Latin word "merces" has several meanings. We often look at the word in terms of pity, thanks or as a reward. This Divine Mercy Sunday look at God's mercy as a free gift. God does not pity us. God's mercy is not a reward for offering enough penance or sacrifice. God's mercy is just that, mercy, or free gift. Do you believe that God loves you enough to forgive you and extend His mercy to you freely? If so, how has that changed the way you relate to God and live in a bond of love with Him? We installed the same ice melt system in the front of the school a couple years ago and it works great. Not only does this melt the snow and ice but it virtually eliminates the need for ice melt and it substantially reduces the risk of a "slip and fall" both outside and inside.

Finally, I wish to thank all those who made our Triduum and Easter celebrations a wonderful experience of prayer. Congratulations to our newly initiated Catholics who were Baptized, Received into the full communion with the Church and Confirmed at the Easter Vigil. Also, many thanks to our entire RCIA Team for their great work in preparing our brothers and sisters for the Easter Sacraments. Thank you to our new Art and Environment director, Michael Hensler, and all his co-workers, who made the church so beautiful. Thank you to all of our musicians and vocalists. Thank you to our ushers, Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors and servers for their service, and thank you to those who shared their faith so beautifully in the reflections given during the "Seven Last Words" Prayer service. Finally, thank you to the many who sent cakes, sausage, eggs, wine and more to the rectory for us to share during Easter. May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for, you always.







### RESPECT LIFE

On this Divine Mercy Sunday, remember nothing is beyond the mercy of God. If you or someone you know is struggling with the aftermath of an abortion, there is help. Project Rachel is a network that includes priests, mental health professionals and others who provide one-on-one assistance to those in need of healing. A local Project Rachel program is offered through the Diocese of Buffalo. You will receive free, nonjudgmental, confidential information by calling the hotline at (716) 847-2211.

From the Diocesan website: "This [Project Rachel] experience, like the Sacrament it includes, is *sensitive*, *private and confidential*... The Project Rachel journey to wholeness helps you cope with the past through the eyes of Faith, opens you to receive forgiveness and the healing grace of God, and allows you to be at peace with yourself, your unborn child, your family, your Church and God.

"Men, too, suffer greatly in the aftermath of abortion. They are fathers who lost a child. They can also find understanding, forgiveness, healing and wholeness through the Church's ministry of Project Rachel.

"To begin your journey to forgiveness and reconciliation, we encourage you to call or write for private counseling. We also provide counseling and services for those who have suffered a miscarriage, stillborn or death of a very young child.

"There is hope after an abortion. It's normal to grieve a pregnancy loss, including the loss of a child by abortion. It can form a hole in one's heart, a hole so deep that sometimes it seems nothing can fill the empty spaces. We care. Let us help you."

children had wonderful facts to share. Then they looked at a dinosaur footprint made out of paper. They thought 43 shoes would fill the dinosaur footprint. The students then took off their shoes and placed them in the footprint. There were 34

shoes that fit inside the print.




