My Dear Parishioners,

Our days of exile are nearing completion! I am grateful that all things are pointing towards an "on-time arrival" into our Church for Masses beginning Saturday, April 14, (2:30 pm confessions and 4:00 pm Mass). To be clear starting with the 4:00 pm weekend Mass on Saturday, April 14, all masses will be in the newly renovated Church. If the situation arises where we can access the Church earlier, for weekday Masses, we will make an announcement at daily Masses, and place notifications on the doors of the Ministry Center. At this point, please make note, that the first Mass scheduled in Church is Saturday, April 14, at 4:00 pm. I am sorry to repeat myself, but I wish to be clear as we transition back to Church.

As you come to our newly refurbished Church, please note that the terrazzo floor is repaired, cleaned and sealed; new flooring has been placed in the balcony; the entire church has been painted; the carpeting replaced in the sanctuary, choir area and sacristy; and new chandeliers and LED lighting installed. Let us not forget our new pews and kneelers.

This weekend and next, you will have the opportunity to drop off your Catholic Charities gift in the vestibule. If you do not have a contribution card, we have blank ones available. I hope and pray that the 1,776 families of St. Greg's who regularly support Catholic Charities, will generously do so again this year. We are counting on you! For the 4,681 families and individuals who are not currently part of the Catholic Charities family of donors, I humble ask you to join us in our effort to serve the needs of the poorest among us in Western New York. If you have never donated, or if it has been some time, I urge you to at least consider the \$10/month (\$120 total/year) donation, which I suggested at last weekend's Masses. It doesn't take long to waste \$10 in a month between the cup of coffee we didn't finish or the snacks we begin and toss out, as well as the little gadgets we buy but never use. Please consider taking that \$10/month "waste" and transform it into a "lavish" gift to help the poor in WNY.

Finally, in the busy-ness of our Parish and our personal lives, do not lose sight of Lent. This weekend's Gospel of the woman caught in adultery reminds us all how we can get caught up in sin and false loves. Our true love is God, and our Lenten call is to abide within His offering of Love, and to trust that everything God has stated is true. Could you imagine a world like this - where everyone trusted and believed in the Word of God? All of us struggle to accept something from the Lord's Word. This "something" usually leads us into sin. Lent is the perfect time to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance. Tuesday, April 9, is our Parish Penance service at 7 pm. We will have many priests available to assist us. Please plan to come. We also have confessions every Wednesday from 5-7 pm for the remainder of Lent. I urge you to use this week wisely for the Sacrament of Penance. The last time we will have confession will be Holy Wednesday from 5 to 7 pm. Although we are here for you for the Sacrament of Penance on that day, it tends to have very long lines, and regardless of the lines, we need to end confessions at, 7 pm in order to attend the evening Parish meetings. If you are hoping to come to confession, please plan to come to this Tuesday's Penance Service – it is by far the best opportunity we have to receive the Sacrament. I pray you make the most out of the Sacrament of Penance and that you make the most out of the remaining week and a half of Lent.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.



SPECIAL NEEDS AND WHEELCHAIR SEATING IN THE NEW PEW AR-RANGEMENT

The first and last rows of the two center sections are designated for people needing assistance. The Eucharist will be brought to people in these rows. The last rows of the two center sections have wider access so that a Eucharistic Minister can move through the rows to distribute Communion.

There are designated spots for people in wheelchairs; most of them are located in rows that have a longer pew behind them (similar to the old layout). Some are located in the front near the statue of Mary, and some are located along the back of the church. There are also spots in the last row of the two center sections. RESPECT LIFE

Physician Assisted Suicide: New Jersey is likely to become the latest state to legalize assisted suicide. A bill allowing the practice has passed both chambers of the state legislature. Governor Phil Murphy (D) has promised to sign the bill, "The Medical Aid in Dying for the Terminally Ill Act," into law.

The bill will allow adults to receive life-ending drugs if they have been told by a doctor that they have less than six months to live.

Critics of the legislation argue that it opens the door for abuse and does not require psychiatric evaluation of patients who may be struggling with depression that is leading to suicidal inclinations.

New Jersey Catholic leaders remain firm in their opposition of the law. Cheryl Riley, director of the Archdiocese of Newark's Respect Life Office, said "We're still not going to stop fighting." As Catholics, [we] should seek to protect "all life," and that there can be blessings associated with the end of someone's life that should not be discounted.

Riley also expressed concern that the law sends a mixed message on suicide, particularly because there has been much effort to prevent young adults and teenagers from ending their lives.

Once the law is signed, New Jersey will join seven other states that allow physician assisted suicide (full text at catholicnewsagency.com).

In January, immediately following the passage of the abortion-expanding Reproductive Health Act (RHA), "The Medical Aid in Dying Act" (A.2694/S.3947) was reintroduced in the New York State Legislature. Given the one-party control of the NYS government, it is very possible that this bill will be passed and then signed into law by Governor Cuomo.






