

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

My Dear Parish Family,

As we come together this weekend, we close a wonderful week of celebrations at St. Greg's. Last week, Friday, May 10, our St. Gregory the Great Eighth Grade Students celebrated and presided over the School's May Crowning, which also serves as a class day celebration with a luncheon for the eight grade after the service. The luncheon was held at the Country Club of Buffalo. On Saturday, May 11, we celebrated First Holy Communion. On both Tuesday, May 14 and Thursday, May 16, we celebrated Confirmation for our high school teenagers. Also on Thursday, May 16, our Third Grade Students, who just received their First Holy Communion, attended school Mass dressed in their beautiful dresses and suits. After they received Communion for the first time at a school Mass, their Eighth Grade buddy knelt before them for a prayer of blessing since they are in the powerful graces of having received the Eucharist. It is always a powerful moment to watch our Eighth Graders humbly kneel before our Third Graders asking for their blessing and prayer.

These celebrations are the "happy" part of discipleship today. I suppose we would all wish for our entire discipleship in Christ to be marked by high points of joy and spiritual intimacy with God and others. Unfortunately, as in every facet of life, it is inevitable for there to be a good amount of hard work, some failure, some success, and moments of frustration in addition to the brilliant moments like those described above. Leaves me to ask the question, what is the key to true discipleship?

I had the privilege to preside and preach at the 9:30 am, First Holy Communion last weekend. Among the many questions I asked our children during the homily, this one: "how is it that we grow from the time we are Baptized and how do we come to experience Jesus?" The first young man who I called upon gave an awesome answer, although all of the answers were great, this one stood out. He said: "we first need to be open to receive the Holy Spirit." Awesome answer and great theology! I told Bishop Malone about his answer and suggested he be appointed to a Diocesan Theological Commission.

Our young friend is exactly correct, the key to true discipleship is being open to the Holy Spirit. In order to truly be a disciple of Christ one must desire it in his/her heart and be open to be led by the Holy Spirit. This is an important point to consider as we look towards the celebration of Pentecost and as we contemplate the ultimate meaning of our Faith this Easter Season. Have you experienced the love of God in a deeper way this Easter? Have you ever deeply experienced the love of God? This is a great question to ponder.

To experience the love of God fills us with joy, exuberance, and excitement to go out and share the good news. We know what excitement is all about. We get excited over a new restaurant or a new draft pick to play for the Bills or Sabres. We get excited over graduation or a vacation or a new car or job. Do we have the same, and hopefully greater, joy over experiencing the love of God?

PASTOR MESSAGE CONTINUED

The Apostles experienced the love of God and were filled with joy, exuberance and excitement that called them to suffer persecution and still be joyful. This same experience of love called them to travel. Think about Sunday's first reading from Acts 14:21-27 and the cities we hear about: Lystra, Iconium, Antioch, Pisidia, Pamphylia, Perga and Attalia. Paul's travels, and these cities were only part of his entire travel plan, took him over 1200 miles to share his excitement, exuberance and joy he knew in the love of God. What is God calling you to do? How is God calling you to invite others? Where is God calling you to serve in His name to share your joy?

The Book of Revelation is sometimes overlooked because it is seen as doom and gloom. Many see the Book of Revelation as only about the final judgment and the end of time. The book is really the opposite. It is a kind of "love story" as we hear a lot of wedding imagery used. Many parts of our Eucharistic liturgy come from the Book of Revelation. We are reminded of the nuptial union between Jesus the groom and the baptized, His spouse. Just the word "revelation" means to reveal or to lay bare. Just as a bride comes to the altar with her veil to meet her groom, so too, we the baptized come to Christ our spouse. In the nuptial union with Christ we are to lay bare our lives and reveal all who we are to Christ, and to be open to the Holy Spirit and allow ourselves to have Christ reveal Himself. If we see that we are the spouse of Christ, then we will experience the excitement, exuberance and joy of the love of God. It is in that experience that we find ourselves not only willing, but conceiving of nothing other than, going out to share the good news as did the Apostles. Do you see yourself as the spouse of Christ? Do you recognize fidelity to Christ as part of that spousal relationship?

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

RESPECT LIFE

Heartbeat Law Passes in Georgia--

Georgia Governor Brian Kemp has approved a law that bans abortion after the detection of a fetal heartbeat. The law will take effect January 1. Georgia is one of eleven states that have proposed or passed similar legislation.

The Living Infants Fairness and Equality (LIFE) Act will limit abortion in the state of Georgia to about the first six weeks of gestation. Presently, abortion is legal in the state until the 20th week of a pregnancy.

"We stand up and speak for those unable to speak for themselves. The LIFE Act is very simple, but also very powerful," said Kemp. The bill is "a declaration that all life has value, that all life matters, that all life is worthy of protection."

Francis J. Mulcahy, the executive director of the Georgia Catholic Conference, said in a statement that the bishops were fully behind the bill.

The American Civil Liberties Union had promised to fight the LIFE Act in court if it was signed into law. Other states have seen similar legislation struck down as unconstitutional by the courts following expensive legal battles. Actress Alyssa Milano threatened to organize a state-wide boycott of Georgia by the film and television industry in protest of the law. So far, a boycott has failed to materialize. a Day in the Life of Early Kindergarten

Our Early Kindergarten program embraces our Early Childhood mission of faith-filled, joyful learning every day through play based learning and collaboration among peers in a safe and nurturing environment. Early Kindergarten is a multi-age (4/5 year old) program that gives the gift of enrichment and time for students before they enter Kindergarten. It is a year for children to grow physically, socially, emotionally, and spiritually as they ready themselves for a successful academic path in Kindergarten and beyond.

A typical morning in EK involves morning meeting, where students pray together, sing, dance, and stretch, and prepare for the fun day of learning ahead. Our writer's workshop time allows the children to journal their own stories and share their ideas with their friends which builds a sense of community and taps into each child's individual interests. Our literacy block is a center-based time where students collaborate in small groups to work on various literacy skills including letter ID, sounds, word work, and reading. We also incorporate our Handwriting Without Tears activities which gives the children a fun, interactive way to enhance their fine motor skills and writing.

In the afternoon we enjoy the playground, our daily special, and dive into our STREAM based centers which include activities such as art, building, math, science and technology.

Throughout the year in EK we love to celebrate birthdays and holidays with class parties, participate in field trips, and complete service projects with our 4th Grade Prayer Partners. Our goal for every child who enters our program is to leave with the tools necessary to not just be ready, but THRIVE in Kindergarten!
