From The Desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family, as you know, this will be the last weekend that I will be with you until December 1^{st} as I begin my sabbatical this Sunday after celebrating Masses and Baptism. I have several thoughts and updates to share with you as we all prepare for these five months.

On the practical side of things, I wish to clarify and update you on a few matters of importance. First, and most important, I am glad to announce that the long awaited St. Gregory the Great Cornerstone "Wall of Fame" was installed last week in the Ministry Center. As you recall, Richard "Rick" Vivacqua and Tom and Angela Vacanti were the first inductees last year at the annual Parish Auction. This year, I am very pleased and honored to announce that both Allegra Perna and Cheryl Bertovich will be inducted as the 2018 Cornerstone honorees at the Parish Auction on Saturday, November 3, at Salvatore's Italian Gardens. Among the many contributions of both Allegra and Cheryl to St. Greg's, they have worked to chair our Great Race for more than twenty years. Congratulations and thank you for all you have done. I hope and pray we all reserve the date to come to honor and thank Allegra and Cheryl for their many contributions to St. Gregory the Great.

At the same time I wish to thank both Allegra and Cheryl and all of our parishioners and friends who assisted to make this year's Great Race another Great event! As always, the weather was awesome as well as the actual race and party afterwards. The Great Race is certainly the "kick off to summer" event for us and I believe a great time was had by all! Thank you to our runners, to all of our workers, our sponsors and all who attended!

It has come to my attention that some do not understand the project of our pews being replaced. I have written about this project in the past and will try to give a brief summary here. One of the projects from the parish's share of **Upon this Rock** was the refinishing of the church pews. As our monies have been coming in, and we are required to spend them, as outlined in the Upon This Rock Campaign. The pews and refinishing of the church floor are being bid out by the Buildings and Grounds committee. Their initial work has shown that replacing the pews will save the parish anywhere from \$10,000 to \$20,000, as replacement costs less than refinishing. The pews are cracked in many spots and were refitted nearly 20 years ago to fit the "in the round" look rather than the original all-straight-facing-forward benches. The kneelers were also retrofitted to work with the new church configuration. The kneelers are really at the complete end of their service life. New church benches and kneelers will actually save the parish money, allow us to have benches that actually fit an "in the round" configuration and be able to be completed in a fraction of the time (about 1 ½ months all at once rather than 6 months or more of a section-by-section approach). This is a project that hopefully will be completed next year. I am awaiting the final recommendation from the Building and Grounds Committee as well as the Finance Council. I hope this clarifies any misconceptions.

Along with misconceptions, there appears to be a falsity that I have cancelled Mission this summer and requested it be moved to Lent. Our annual summer Mission in fact is postponed and being moved to Lent. This recommendation was from the leadership of Mission itself and not engineered by me as the pastor. Given some changes in Mission's lay leadership, Sr. Shawn now becoming the Spiritual Director of Mission, and other factors, the Mission leadership team felt it best to wait until Lent. They also felt that more people will take advantage of Mission in Lent. Lent is a natural time that many think of more spiritual growth opportunities. I am thankful to Deacon Peter for his leadership of Mission last year and I am thankful to Sr. Shawn for her willingness to pick up the role of Spiritual Director for Mission. (continued on pg. 2)

Thank you to all who make Mission an awesome experience every year. I hope and pray our team will persevere and plan Mission for Lent as they propose, and I give them my full support as I have every year at St. Greg's. I look forward to Mission every year myself and actually have been present almost every night of the seven nights of Mission since 2014 when I arrived as Pastor.

Finally, as a priest for 26 years and a pastor for 13 years, I have learned many things about my call, duty, role and responsibility as a priest and pastor. I hope and pray to learn more as I take this sabbatical to pray, rest, study, write, read and travel. The core responsibility of a priest and pastor is to re-orientate our reality to God's Truth. This is a complicated task in this age of relativism where many desire their own reality to be "truth" without regard to how their "reality" interacts with God's Truth. If we live in the Truth of God, then we live in the freedom of God's sons and daughters. If we live the lies of the secular world, then we usually live in anger towards those who espouse a life of faith.

Over our four plus years together, I have called our parish family to the Truth of God and to reject whatever does not speak of the Gospel. At times this has evoked a greater sense of unity among those who desire fully to be part of the Body of Christ and at other times it has caused division as we are confronted with cold facts that many things we wish to accept as "ok" or "it's your choice" are in opposition to the Gospel. As a pastor, I will not put the Gospel second to anything. Please know that I love everyone in our parish family. I love those who are striving to live a holy life in full compliance with the Gospel and I love those who have challenged the Gospel and my right to preach it. I do love you all. This love includes the fact that my ultimate goal is for each of us to be in Heaven. The path to Heaven is quite clear in our Catholic Catechism and Scripture. The road to Hell is also quite clear. My role, responsibility, privilege and right is to keep our family on the path towards Heaven. As the "Father" of this family, I cannot create a new normal that is not of God.

As I move into the gift of these five months of prayer, reflection, study, travel and rest, I will pray daily for you as I ask you pray for me. Together may we emerge in December as more open to embracing the Truth of God into our lives and more committed to working together to abiding within the Church and Body of Christ. May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always!

Respect Life

Preserving Religious Freedom Religious (from USCCB.org): Although Americans generally do not face the kind of violent persecution endured by many people of faith around the world, Pope Francis [spoke] of a "polite persecution" that many people face, as "when someone is persecuted not

for confessing Christ's name, but for wanting to demonstrate the values of the Son of God".

Religious freedom continues to be threatened in the U.S., drastically limiting the Church's ability to help those in need. Three examples:

Catholic foster care and adoption services. Boston, San Francisco, the District of Columbia, and the State of Illinois forced local Catholic Charities out of adoption or foster care services—by revoking their licenses, ending government contracts, or both—because they refused to place children with same-sex couples or unmarried opposite-sex couples who cohabit.

Immigration laws and policies. Several states have passed laws that forbid what they call "harboring" undocumented immigrants—and what the Church deems Christian charity and pastoral care to immigrants. After urging a ban on Muslim migrants and refugees during the campaign, the new Administration has imposed special restrictions on entry into the United States from several Muslim-majority countries.

Discrimination against Catholic humanitarian services. After years of excellent performance by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Migration and Refugee Services (MRS) in administering contract services for victims of human trafficking, the federal government changed its grant specifications to require MRS to provide or refer for contraceptive and abortion services in violation of Catholic teaching.

Pope Francis has asked American Catholics to protect religious freedom, both in the U.S. and throughout the world.

"[Religious] freedom remains one of America's most precious possessions. [The] U.S. Bishops have reminded us ...all are called to be vigilant, precisely as good citizens, to preserve and defend that freedom from everything that would threaten or compromise it."
