The book is beautifully written and illustrated, and takes us on a bus trip with a grandma and her grandson. The book starts with grandma and her grandson leaving Mass and getting on a bus. Throughout the journey, the young boy witnesses kids his age riding in a car with headphones in and ipods in their hands -- something he does not have. He questions grandma about why he does not have those things. The story concludes with them getting off the bus and going to volunteer at a soup kitchen. One of the main themes is the importance of community and to have a grateful heart. We hope to build upon these themes to teach our students that comparison can be the thief of joy and to appreciate the beauty that surrounds you. One goal for our faculty and staff this year will be to focus on developing relationships with students. Our second main goal will be curriculum using the question: "What do we want students to learn?"

This is a very exciting time in education where we can work together as a community to teach students how to live as followers of Jesus and make good decisions. Please continue to pray for our school community as we work together to create a warm, loving, and inclusive environment where all families and parishioners are welcome. We will pray for our Parish community and continue to be grateful for your support of our amazing school.

Respect Life

On Families: "Family life is a sacrifice but a beautiful sacrifice. ...Love in marriage is a challenge for the man and for the woman. ...It is not easy to raise children. ...

But it is important to educate them about community, educate them about family life. Teach them about making sacrifices for one another.

"The difficulties are major. [But] the family is an adventure, a beautiful adventure! And today — I say this with heartache — we see that so often one thinks about starting a family and getting married as if it were a lottery: 'Let's go. If it works, it works. If it doesn't work, we cancel the matter and start over'. This is a superficiality about the greatest gift God has given to humanity: the family. Because, after the account of the creation of man, God shows that He created man and woman in His image and likeness. And when Jesus Himself talks about marriage, He says: 'A man shall leave his father and mother and with his wife shall become one flesh.' Because they are the image and likeness of God. You are the icon of God: the family is the icon of God. Man and woman are the very image of God. He said so, I am not saying it. And this is great; it is sacred.

"Then today — it hurts to say it — we speak of 'diversified' families: different types of family. Yes, it is true that the word 'family' is an analogical term, because it refers to the 'family' of stars, to 'families' of trees, to 'families' of animals ... it is an analogical term. But the human family as the image of God, man and woman, is one alone. It is one alone." —Pope Francis, *Address to Delegation of the Forum of Family Associations*, 6/16/18


