#### From the Desk of Richard Patti

Greetings all,

For those of you who don't know me, my name is Richard Patti and I'm the high-school youth minister here at St. Greg's. Having just finished my first year here at the parish, I wanted to take this opportunity to share a few tips I learned on the job. My time here has been both a blessing and a learning experience, so in no particular order, here are life lessons from a 22 year old:

It is hard to improve if you keep doing the same thing. Oftentimes, our unwillingness to change is what keeps us from getting better. We get stuck in our comfort zone and are unwilling to risk any sort of change because we are afraid. It's better to try and fail than to never try at all. That mindset should be applied to anything you do. Whether it is your job, your ministry, or even your prayer life, making an effort to change is the only way you can continue to improve.

It's not about you. In everything you do, you are working to glorify God, not glorify yourself. Jesus gave His life for you; therefore it only makes sense that we should live our lives for Him. My job is to bring kids closer to Christ. Not closer to me. If St. Greg's Youth Ministry ever becomes about what I've done or about what I've accomplished then I will have failed in my job as a youth minister. Working hard and having people appreciate what you do is great. Just remember that the Man upstairs should be getting all the credit.

God has you where you are for a reason. Believe it. As soon as you believe that, everything you do will take on a whole new meaning. God has blessed you with gifts and talents. Even if there are days when you feel that you are inadequate, unworthy, or not good enough, just know that you are part of God's divine plan. Let that be what motivates you. To borrow a tried and true cliché, "God doesn't call the qualified, he qualifies the called."

It's okay if you don't know everything. Lack of knowledge is not in and of itself a problem; it is only when you fail to ask for help that it can become one. No one knows everything. I've seen college professors use Google to help me answer what seems to be a simple question. Never be afraid to ask for help.

Be authentic. Don't pretend to be someone God only created one person like vou're not. you. Own it. Be true to yourself so people can get to know the real you, not someone you are pretending to be.

Take care of yourself. Before helping others, it is imperative that you first take care of yourself. If you have ever flown on a plane, you have heard this phrase: "In case of a decrease in cabin pressure, secure your own oxygen mask before helping others." Your own needs, whether they are physical, mental, emotional, or spiritual have to come first. I can't lead teens closer to Christ if I do not continue to grow in my relationship with Him. In the same way, none of us can make others know the Father's love for them if we first don't acknowledge His love for us.

Know your limits. Admitting that we have limits is quite sobering. However, this can prove to be beneficial when thinking about certain aspects of our lives. Know what you're capable of and do it to the best of your ability. God will not ask of you anything that you are not capable of doing.

Trust God. Sometimes it's hard to relinguish control of your life, but you have to trust that God has things under control. It's not always easy, but surrendering your life to Him is a recipe for happi-Taking this job was a leap of faith for ness. I'd be lying if I said it was easy. I would not be lying if I said that I've never felt more fulfillment in my life than I have in my time here. **AMDG**

#### **Catechist's Corner**

The role of a Catechist is to teach our faith by word and example.

The Pope sent out his letter to Catechists on the occasion of the International Congress on Catechesis, which took place at the Pontifical Catholic University of Buenos Aires...

In his message, the Pope shared an anecdote about St. Francis of Assisi. When one of the saint's followers wanted to learn how to preach, St. Francis replied, "When we visit the sick, help children, give food to the poor, we are already preaching." When it comes to how they carry out their role, the Pope said Catechists should keep in mind Jesus' style of reaching out to people: He adapted to the people around Him in order to bring them the love of God.

The Pope said that although God's message is unchanging and always the same, a Catechist needs to be creative and find ever new ways to transmit that message. There is no reason to be afraid of finding new ways to reach people, Pope Francis said, because Jesus has already done it.

Finally, Catechists should be joyful messengers, guardians of goodness and beauty, which should shine through in their lives.




