

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

My Dear Parish Family,

We give praise and thanks to Almighty God for the Ordination of Jerry Hodson to the Permanent Diaconate this weekend at St. Joseph's Cathedral. On Saturday, May 25, Jerry was Ordained and is now "Deacon Jerry" and on Sunday, May 26, he will "Deacon" for the first time at St. Greg's at the 11:00 am Mass. Congratulations Deacon Jerry and congratulations to Eileen, his wife, on assuming this important role in our Church. Please know of our continued love, support and prayers as you begin to live Diaconate Ministry!

As you can see, we are continuing to work on our St. Greg's campus. Currently we are replacing the section of the roof over the Ministry Center Gym. We are also working to install the new heating system for our sidewalks and obviously replacing our concrete as a result. As I mentioned in January when I spoke at all of the Masses about our renovations, we are installing heated sidewalks at all entrances of the church. The purpose, first and foremost, is safety. As you may recall, we installed the same system a couple years ago in front of the school. The system has worked well to not only melt, but often evaporate, the snow and ice. This has minimized the need for ice melt products. It has also minimized the floors getting wet and slippery on the inside from melting snow falling off of shoes and boots. Finally, with the terrazzo floor restored, we hope to preserve the floor from further pitting caused by the ice melt products. I apologize for any inconvenience caused by our renovation work, but the work does need to be accomplished. The contractors are doing a great job on a timely basis.

# THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD: MAY 30

This is a Holy Day of Obligation. Masses are: May 29, Vigil Mass at 7:00 pm; May 30, at 7:00 am, 8:00 am, 12:00 noon and 7:00 pm.

As you may have noticed, we have made a change regarding the votive candles. The obvious concern over having votive candles is fire prevention and safety. Almost weekly we have noticed candles that have burned improperly and caused the plastic container for the candle to melt and sometimes burn. We have also had a problem with the wooden lighting sticks. Some people do not blow out the flame prior to putting it into the glass and sand container. Some people do not check to be sure that the stick actually has been extinguished in the sand. This has caused the container of sticks to also burn. We have eliminated the wooden sticks and are currently using butane lighters. I understand that they are not the easiest to use. We are trying to resolve this concern at the moment. Please know that fire prevention is our first concern regarding this issue. We have looked at the possibility to move to electric candles. That option is simply cost prohibitive. To replace the number of racks and candles that we currently own would be between \$75,000 and \$100,000. Please know that we are looking for an appropriate and safe solution to the concerns being raised to us over this matter.

#### PASTOR MESSAGE CONTINUED

Finally, and of most importance, this weekend we mark Memorial Day. It seems that almost every week we have a funeral for one of our veterans, especially those who served in World War II. As we celebrate this weekend, please offer a prayer and some reflection upon what these brave men and women have done for us. Of course, we especially remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice of their lives for our country, but we also remember those who are veterans and those who currently serve our great nation.

This weekend is a time to focus on what we truly stand for as a nation. What are our national goals and values? I have often heard veterans sadly say, "This isn't what I risked my life for" when they look and see how the values of their era are being replaced with different ways of thinking and living. I was at a funeral recently and the priest who presided gave the homily for the 93 year old gentleman. The priest made an interesting observation that the man did not have an identity crisis. He knew who he was as a man of Faith and as a member of the community. He knew his role as husband, father and doctor. He went on to state that he had the same traditional Catholic values and morals all of his life. They did not change. The priest then posed the question, an excellent question, whether some of our personal identity questions/issues today are the result of a loss of values and morals. His observation was that we never really hear about the "older" generation in their 80's and 90's suffering from an identity crisis or wondering "who they are?" It simply was not part of their life experiences as a whole. Several months ago I wrote an article in the Bulletin about the greatest generation of our nation, and many commented on the accuracy of what I observed and wrote in that article. This great generation knew their identity and made awesome contributions!

This Memorial Day, we remember and thank all those who have died serving our nation as well as all those who have served and who currently serve. Maybe we can add one more reflection. Perhaps we can take a little time to reflect on what made these individuals the great men and women that they were and are. I believe my brother priest was on to a great point in that homily. Maybe some of our identity issues that we face today are because we have forgotten who we are. As a nation, maybe we have forgotten the real meaning of freedom? We are often reminded, "Freedom isn't free!" Freedom does not mean that we can each do whatever we want. That is reckless freedom at best. As a people of faith, have we also forgotten who we are as the "Body of Christ?" Freedom won on the Cross with the blood of Jesus Christ isn't really free unless we truly believe and desire to live as a member of His body in the world today. The freedom to live as a son or daughter of Christ means that we are bound to each other and have duties and responsibilities to our Church, world and personally to one another.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.



#### RESPECT LIFE

Praying for Governor Cuomo: Following the passage of the Reproductive Health Act, Jack, a nine-year-old Catholic boy in the Archdiocese of New York, decided to start a prayer campaign for the express purpose of praying for the conversion of Governor Andrew Cuomo. Cuomo, a Catholic, signed the radical abortion expansion bill on January 22. Cuomo is also responsible for the legalization of same-sex marriage in New York and is currently advocating for legislation to allow physician -assisted suicide.

Based on his son's idea, Jack's father created a website, **ConvertCuomo.com**, where people can pledge to pray and fast for the governor. "I hope that it will have up to 1,000 people praying for Governor Cuomo and that if we get enough people praying on the website abortion in New York will stop," Jack said, "and I also hope that Governor Cuomo will soon have so many prayers that he will want to become pro-life." To date, almost 2000 people have pledged their prayers.

The Respect Life Offices for the Diocese of Albany and the Archdiocese of New York, as well as the Archdiocese of New York Public Policy Office and the New York State Catholic Conference, have all offered their support for the campaign, promoting it via their Facebook pages.
