In the coming months we will offer different opportunities for your spiritual growth and enrichment. I would like to make you aware of some of them now so you may "save the date" on your calendar. They include:

- Friday, August 16, at 7:00 pm: We welcome St. Luke's Productions that will offer a musical about St. Maximillian Kolbe. This is a professional production and will be well-timed for our Diocese. August will begin the year of lawsuits to be filed against clergy, teachers, coaches, youth workers and anyone who has been accused of sexually abusing a minor. As repugnant and inexcusable as that act is, we also cannot lose sight of the countless "hero" priests and clergy who have inspired us. St. Maximillian Kolbe is one of those "hero" priests. As we pray for those who were victims of abuse, perhaps we can pray through the intercession of St. Maximillian Kolbe, and witness the portrayal of his story in our church as a gift of hope in a difficult time. Please plan to attend this event. A free-will offering will be taken at the end to help defray our costs of bringing this production to St. Greg's.
- Wednesday, September 11, at 7:00 pm: We will welcome Dan Lawson, a Catholic therapist, who will offer a workshop and evening of recollection on Marriage. This night is free-of -charge and is ideal for all married couples regardless of how many years (or how many days for newlyweds) you are married. It is also ideal for engaged couples to come.
- Tuesday, October 15, thru Thursday, October 17: We will focus three days on healing. On Tuesday, October 15, Dan Lawson will return to St. Greg's to offer a workshop for anyone and everyone, regardless of age, who has suffered a loss or pain because of divorce. On Wednesday, October 16, Dan will return again to work with adults in particular, who have, or are currently experiencing, the pain of a divorce. Our youth ministry team will be working with our youth at the same time that Wednesday to address the issues facing them when they live through their parents' divorce.

- Additionally, on Thursday, October 17, we will welcome Father David Bellittiere, Pastor of Fourteen Holy Helpers Parish in West Seneca. Father David is known for his healing ministry and will celebrate a healing Mass for us which will include the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Anyone who is suffering physically, emotionally, mentally, spiritually can be Anointed as we pray for healing in every way. Each evening begins at 7:00 pm.
- Thursday, December 5, will be our Advent night of recollection. <u>The Vigil Project</u> will be leading us in a spiritual night of reflection and worship beginning at 7:00 pm.
- Finally, please reserve March 2, 3, and 4, 2020 for our Lenten retreat. This coming Lent we are proud to welcome Dr. John Bergsma from Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio. Dr. Bergsma is a Scripture scholar and professor. More important than his "knowledge" of the Scripture is his personal and intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. He is an extraordinary man who has a gift to combine scholarship with his deep faith. Please make time for this wonderful retreat this coming Lent. As always, Dr. Bergsma will offer a different presentation each day and will offer it twice a day at 12:45 (after the noon Mass) and at 7:00 pm. More information will follow as we get closer.

RESPECT LIFE

AMA and Assisted Suicide: The American Medical Association (AMA) again rejected physician-assisted suicide by an overwhelming majority, despite lobbying by euthanasia supporters. After intense discussion, delegates at the June 10 annual meeting in Chicago voted 392-162 to reaffirm the AMA's existing policy, which states that "Physicianassisted suicide and euthanasia are fundamentally incompatible with the physician's role as healer, would be difficult or impossible to control, and would pose serious societal risks."

Alex Schadenberg, executive director of the Euthanasia Prevention Coalition, described the vote as "great news." "The AMA have reaffirmed that assisting the suicide of patients is not ethical or a part of medicine ... We can only hope that the decision of the AMA will result in an understanding that doctors should never be involved with killing their patients." Washington delegate Dr. Shane Macaulay pointed to Canada and Oregon in warning of the dangers of legalizing physician-assisted suicide. "Oregon legalized assisted suicide in 1997 with repeated assurances that it would stay contained and would not become euthanasia," he said. "Just last month, the Oregon State House of Representatives approved a bill to allow patient death by lethal injection, showing the inevitable progression from assisted suicide to euthanasia once physicians have accepted the idea that taking a patient's life is permissible."

Since Canada legalized assisted suicide and euthanasia three years ago, "euthanasia has become a runaway contagion in Canada, with over 4,000 deaths last year," observed Macaulay. (Full text at lifesitenews.com)

Physician-Assisted Suicide in NY: By the end of the 2019 NY legislative session, advocates for the legalization of physician-assisted suicide **failed** to get a vote on the bill in any committee in either house, despite Gov. Cuomo's support. The NY Catholic Conference and the NY Alliance Against Assisted Suicide were successful in highlighting the many dangerous consequences of such a policy.
