

#### FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

My Dear Parish Family,

As we celebrate this Sunday we are reminded of the art of hospitality. I call it an "art" because I believe hospitality is not only a degree program in college, but an art. The question to ponder is if it is a lost art in your life or one that is active and alive?

This Sunday's first reading tells us about Abraham welcoming three visitors. He prepares a big meal and cares for them in a grand style. Abraham does not go without a reward. Because of his hospitality to the three visitors he receives a son a year later. Today's Gospel offers the familiar passage of Martha and Mary. This is the famous Gospel where Martha is seen as the busy one and tries to get her sister, Mary, into trouble with Jesus for just sitting at his feet and listening to him. Sometimes we paint a negative picture of Martha, and maybe I just did the same here, but we really see two different forms of hospitality. On one hand, Martha was like Abraham, trying to provide good hospitality for Jesus. I am sure she wanted to provide a wonderful meal for their good friend. Mary, on the other hand, is also exercising hospitality.

She is spending time with Jesus, in the position of a disciple, sitting at His feet, listening and learning from Him. Both are exercising the gift of hospitality in different ways. Mary, however, is choosing the better part, as Jesus states, because she is giving the gift of time and opening her own call of discipleship to be nourished. For Martha, welcoming Jesus meant cooking and cleaning. For Mary, welcoming Jesus meant spending time with Him. How do you welcome Jesus? Do you welcome Jesus into your heart in silence or do you busy yourself with good works, and a routine of prayer cards or rituals filled only with words, and no time to sit in silence and listen to Him?

I love visiting our Adoration Chapel, and I particularly enjoy being in our chapel in the rectory. Although I will spend time in the chapel, with my breviary for prayer, I enjoy most the time to simply sit in His presence. I have often commented on prayer with the following question: "when you pray, do you give God instructions or do you report for duty?" I think Martha was the type giving God instructions, concerned so much about physical things. "Martha, Martha, Martha, you are concerned about so many things. Only one thing is necessary and Mary has chosen the better part and she will not be deprived of it."

I suppose I could be guilty of judging right now, but I do observe people in our Chapel sometimes. I find some people reading the Scripture or praying the Rosary. I find others reading the Sunday Bulletin and/or the **Western New York Catholic** newspaper. Finally, I find some who are sitting in silent meditation. I suppose a healthy prayer life may include all of the above, but to what measure of each?

I have learned that the days I take the time to pray in silence in the midst of a very busy agenda are the same days I realize all the work did get done in addition to time for prayer. Also, I usually get my work done faster! The majority of us are extremely busy. Sometimes conversations develop into a sparring match to see who is more convincing that they are the busiest person with no time to spare. Often I have been told by people that they would pray if there was more time in the day. I suppose under that statement, if our Good Lord added a 25th hour to each day, we would all spend it in prayer? Maybe or maybe not?

This week consider spending just a half hour in prayer. Maybe go to your "God cave" (we know what a man cave is) in your house, or come to our Adoration Chapel to be "Mary." Whether you are a regular to the Adoration Chapel or to your favorite chair at home to sit and pray, this time, come completely alone to sit with Jesus. The Scripture reminds us that Jesus sent them out to teach, preach and heal, and told them not to take an extra tunic, nor a walking stick, nor money or extra sandals. Jesus wanted them to be unencumbered to serve the Gospel. My advice this week: for thirty minutes, go unencumbered – no Bulletin, no newspaper, no prayer book, no Rosary, or spiritual book or Bible, just go yourself with nothing else and sit with the Lord and listen.

This weekend we have the end of our week-long Mission. Thank you to the Mission team and the candidates who made it a priority to come, sit and listen and be with the Lord each night. It is always an amazing experience. Also this weekend we welcome back home our Missionaries who went to Jamaica for our parish's annual service Mission trip. I hope and pray you had a fruitful experience. Also, thank you to everyone who assisted with our annual picnic for people with disabilities last weekend. Finally, thank you to all who have assisted with our Summer Vacation Bible School a week ago as well as the many religious education programs offered through our Family Faith Department this summer.

In all of the busyness of these beautiful programs and events, I hope and pray you also experienced the quiet of coming to the Lord. Thank you one and all for everything you do and participate in at St. Greg's to develop and truly be a faithful disciple of Christ in the world today.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.



The focus on spiritual healing is clearly emphasized in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*: "Indeed the Sacrament of Reconciliation brings about a true 'spiritual resurrection,' restoring the dignity and blessings of the children of God, of which the most precious is friendship with God" (1468).

# USCCB and the Death Penalty:

On June 13, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bish-

ops (USCCB) overwhelmingly approved a revised passage on the death penalty for the U.S. Catholic Catechism for Adults (USCCA).

In 2018, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith released Pope Francis' revision to the teaching on the death penalty in the universal Catechism of the Catholic Church (no. 2267) as follows:

"Recourse to the death penalty on the part of legitimate authority, following a fair trial, was long considered an appropriate response to the gravity of certain crimes, and an acceptable, albeit extreme, means of safeguarding the common good.

"Today, however, there is an increasing awareness that the dignity of the person is not lost even after the commission of very serious crimes. In addition, a new understanding has emerged of the significance of penal sanctions imposed by the state. Lastly, more effective systems of detention have been developed, which ensure the due protection of citizens but, at the same time, do not definitively deprive the guilty of the possibility of redemption.

"Consequently, the Church teaches, in the light of the Gospel, that 'the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person,' and she works with determination for its abolition worldwide."

In response, the Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis of the USCCB prepared a new section on the death penalty for the U.S. Catholic Catechism for Adults (USCCA), based extensively on this new language.

The USCCB's revised statement would replace the current text in the USCCA (pp. 394-395) pending formal approval from the Holy See. (usccb.org)


