

HEALING FROM SEPARATION/DIVORCE

St. Greg's will be hosting a 2 part series for those who have been affected by Separation and/or Divorce. Dan Lawson is back at St. Greg's to offer a 2 day program starting October 15..

October 15 – An open general talk and presentation to instill hope and healing. This session is for anyone who has been affected by divorce or separation including adults, teens, grandparents, or loved ones.

October 16 – This day is designed for two groups:

- A) Divorced/separated individuals. This part of the program is designed to assist in the healing process of a divorce/separation. It is intended to assist individuals to move out of the pain from the past and move toward their preferred future.
- B) Teenage children who have been affected by divorce or separation in their family. The teens will have a separate talk to help them navigate through the uncertainty that comes with divorce and separation. This program will help them identify means to cope with the feelings and thoughts that come along.

St. Gregory the Great School CAFETERIA PROJECT UPDATE

The cafeteria project was established as a way to build community within the Grade 4 (now Grade 6) class and to address the deteriorating state of the tables, dated decor, and institutional look of the cafeteria. During the 2017-18 school year students in the Grade 4 began to work in small groups to brainstorm ideas for an updated cafeteria, including round tables to facilitate better communication, updated color schemes, murals, and a lounge area. As the students moved into the Grade 5, the Enriched ELA class was tasked with taking their classmates ideas and creating a presentation shown at the Great Dinner Auction 2018 for Fund an Item. To date, the students have helped raise approximately \$13,000 towards the purchase of new round tables and updated décor.

WHY DO I HAVE TO GO TO MASS? (PART II)

Yes, sometimes it's easier said than done, but forgiveness can provide great freedom and healing for us. We witness a miracle. We witness the bread and wine change into the Body and Blood of Christ. When we receive Communion, we receive the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus. For us as Catholics, this is not a symbol but the true presence of Christ. We are strengthened in body and in spirit.

We share in the peace of Christ. At the sign of peace we reach out to others and experience the kind of peace that the world cannot give. (Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. (*Jn 14:27*)

We receive a special blessing. The priest blesses us and commissions us to take the love and peace of the Lord into the world. ("Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord.")

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATON

BAPTISM, RECONCILIATION AND EUCHARIST FOR OLDER CHILDREN

Typically, children receive Baptism as infants and prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist when they are in Grades 2 and 3. When this does not happen, they need to be prepared for these Sacraments when they are older. At St. Greg's children and their families and/or sponsors are placed in a Children's Catechumenate and the process is called **RCIA** (**Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults**). Through this process, older children who have missed Sacraments are prepared to receive them. If you have a family member ages 7-18 who has missed a Sacrament (s), please contact Joan Rischmiller (**jrischmiller@stgregs.org)** in the FFF Office at **688-5760**. 

SAINT CARDINAL JOHN HENRY NEWMAN

This weekend, Blessed Cardinal John Henry Newman, along with four other Blesseds, will be canonized together in St. Peter's Square, October 13, in Rome.

Indian Sister Marian Thresia, founder of the Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Family; Italian Sister Giuseppina Vannini; Brazilian Sister Dulce Lopes Pontes; and Marguerite Bays, a Swiss consecrated virgin of the Third Order of St. Francis, will be canonized alongside Newman.


Newman was a 19th century theologian, poet, Catholic priest and cardinal. Originally an Anglican priest, he converted to Catholicism in 1845 and his writings are considered among some of the most important Church writings in recent centuries. Following is a prayer attributed to him:

"God has created me to do Him some definite service. He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission. I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good; I shall do His work. I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it if I do but keep His commandments. Therefore, I will trust Him, whatever I am; I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him. In perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him. If I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. He does nothing in vain..."
