Endurance calls us to refocus on our true belief in Jesus Christ and His presence to us in the Sacraments. Endurance means that we still see our connection to one another as the Body of Christ, and our call to support one another as any true family supports one another "in thick and thin." Endurance means that I continue to support all that needs to be accomplished with my time, talent and treasure.

To take things out of the context of the Church for a moment, there are issues I see with our State and Country. For example, I do not agree that my tax dollars go to support abortion and the termination of human life and to promote other issues which I find morally objectionable. This disagreement, anger and disappointment have not led me away from being a citizen to uphold the Constitution of our State and Nation. Despite my concerns, I continue to pay my taxes and abide by the laws of the State of New York and our Country.

I hope my point is clear. Despite the situation we are in and despite the justified feelings we may have, please endure with our Catholic Faith. Please endure with St. Gregory the Great Parish and the Diocese of Buffalo. Please endure with our State of New York and this great Nation of the United States. Today's message is simple and clear: endure, whether it is convenient or inconvenient. I believe this is the true test of our love and faith and to whom we are connected in the beginning and the end: Jesus Christ.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.


"LETTER TO A SUFFERING CHURCH" HAS ARRIVED




The Early Childhood Program celebrated the Feast of St. Francis with the children having their favorite stuffed animal blessed by Fr. Leon and Fr Paul in Church.

BAPTISM, RECONCILIATION AND EUCHARIST FOR OLDER CHILDREN

Typically, children receive Baptism as infants and prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist when they are in Grades 2 and 3. When this does not happen, they need to be prepared for these Sacraments when they are older. At St. Greg's children and their families and/or sponsors are placed in a Children's Catechumenate and the process is called **RCIA** (**Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults**). Through this process, older children who have missed Sacraments are prepared to receive them. 


