Many years ago when I was serving at St. Amelia Parish in Tonawanda I wanted to begin a scholarship fund to annually assist a graduating high-school senior attend college. The basic requirement was the high-schooler's involvement in our parish's youth ministry, general parish ministries and service to the larger community in the name of St. Amelia Parish. As I announced this scholarship, one parishioner contacted me and generously donated \$25,000 to begin the fund. I will never forget his exact words to me: He said: "I am getting older and I cannot physically do the work you are doing with our youth, but money I have, and it is yours if it will help you accomplish your goal." In that story the gifts of time, talent and treasure come together

Today, as many pull away from financially supporting our parish, I encourage all to reflect on their stewardship. If you have rescinded your financial support, will you step up and give of your time in our Adoration Chapel to pray for the parish for a few hours each week? Will you give a few hours per week of your time to physically do the work of the Church here at St. Greg's?

A couple weeks ago I suggested in my article that there were many other victims of the abuse crisis. Of course those sexually abused have suffered greatly, and now there are the ripple effects. At St. Greg's we had over two dozen students not return to St. Gregory the Great School because their families could not afford the increased tuition. They are now victims. People have lost their jobs both at St. Greg's and in the Diocese because of a lack of funds. They are now victims. People who could receive work are not because we have had to eliminate positions when they became vacant. They are now victims. Some individuals needing ministry are not receiving it on a timely basis because we simply do not have the staff in place to handle all of the requests. They are now victims. This week alone I was not able to honor our parish's usual commitment to assist the Bison Fund nor to Chesterton Academy. These students are now victims. The list could go on and on, but I believe you see the ripple effect.

This week, please consider your stewardship of time, talent and treasure. You serve the Gospel, not a particular human being who is your pastor or bishop. The decisions each of us make now regarding our response to our anger and disappointment will have long lasting ripple effects. These ripple effects may eventually hurt the very people who are making the decisions to withdraw their support now.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

UPDATE FROM MIDDLE SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptism, Reconciliation and Eucharist for Older Children: Typically, children receive Baptism as infants and prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist when they are in Grades 2 and 3. Occasionally, when this does not happen, they need to be prepared for these Sacraments when they are older. Here at St. Gregory's, we have a process for these children and their families. Children and their families and/or sponsors are placed in a Children's Catechumenate and the process is called RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for **Adults**). Through this process, older children who have missed Sacraments can be prepared to receive them as needed. If you have a family member ages 7 -18 who needs to be prepared for a missed Sacrament(s), please contact Joan Rischmiller (irischmiller@stgregs.org) in the FFF Office at 688-5760.

Confirmation 2020 Candidates:

CATECHIST'S CORNER

The role of a Catechist is to teach our faith.

"As a Catechist, you have a unique opportunity to shape future generations through your time with students. While it is important to present good content in your classroom, it is critical that you witness to your love for your Faith. Simple ways to do this include the following:

- Talk about how you see God moving in your life. This will help to create a culture in your classroom where students will also feel comfortable sharing their faith.
- Share your story of faith. If you haven't thought about your story of faith, now is a good time to think about it. You don't have to share your entire story; snippets of spiritual wisdom might be all the students need to see where God is moving in their lives.
- Use the "J" word. Sometimes as Catholics we are afraid of talking about our love for Jesus. There is power in the Holy Name of Jesus. Speaking about the Jesus you know and love will help your students recognize that a personal relationship with Jesus is a normal part of the Catholic Faith.¹


SENIOR CITIZENS


