

Greetings St. Greg's,

A story needs to be shared about the retreat we had last weekend and the progress of Young Adult Ministry here at St. Gregory the Great. I first would like to give all glory to the Lord for how far we have come. The Holy Spirit is truly at work and I'm blessed to be a witness. It's amazing how the Lord can move.

We've come a long way from humble beginnings with the young adults (18-30somethings). When I first started work on with this age group, I took a look at how big it was. With almost 5,000 people who fit between 18-40 on the parish's books, I was floored with how big the task is. Especially since the majori-

ty of those are missing from the pews. We had to roll up were energized for more. With uplifting live music led by Michael Cygan, no one was left sitting during praise

The first task was to build a team, a Core Team of volunteers who could give their time and talent to the cause. The Lord provided. Our team has grown and become more capable as we jelled over the past two years. They are passionate, faithful, and willing to serve. We



pour into relational ministry and hospitality to create an environment that even hardened hearts would find welcoming. This has set the stage for the growing and positive response to Amped, our flagship young adult event, and to our retreats. We are steadily growing from a handful of participants to surging into the 40's and 50's.

This weekend was Brave II, a powerful and prayerful experience calling our participants out of the boat like Peter. Built around Matthew's account of walking on water (Matt 14:22-33), we followed along the theme of

being brave in the storm. Our team and priests/ seminarian (Fr. Paul, Fr. Moses, and Joe Tokasz) delivered thought-provoking and enthusiastic sessions designed to explore our relationship with Jesus and call us to action.

The over 40 young adults who journeyed to Allegany

were energized for more. With uplifting live music led by Michael Cygan, no one was left sitting during praise and worship. Our prayer experiences at Mass and in front of the Blessed Sacrament opened up hearts across the room. These young adults are passionate and empowered to move forward, not because of anything we did, but what the Holy Spirit has been doing.

Continue to pray for us as we keep moving forward,

led by the Holy
Spirit, to keep leading people to
Christ. The task at hand is large but the seed is growing. As
Fr. Dave Pivanka of the Wild Goose series leads, "Come Holy Spirit, come Holy Spirit..."

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

BAPTISM, RECONCILIATION AND EUCHARIST FOR OLDER CHILDREN

Typically, children receive Baptism as infants and prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist when they are in Grades 2 and 3. When this does not happen, they need to be prepared for these Sacraments when they are older. At St. Greg's children and their families and/or sponsors are placed in a Children's Catechumenate and the process is called **RCIA** (**Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults**). Through this process, older children who have missed Sacraments are prepared to receive them. Kairos Prison Ministry International is holding their December Kairos Retreat at Wende CF from December 5th through December 8th, and your support is greatly needed. First of all we need your prayers. Please begin praying for the success of the weekend today and continue to lift the team and inmates up in prayer until the weekend concludes. If you are able to pray for a specific hour during the weekend, please contact Mark Duguay at mgduguay@gmail.com and let him know the day and hour during the weekend you are willing to pray. Late night and early morning hours are badly needed. Secondly, we need letters of encouragement for each inmate. Since this weekend is in December you can give the inmates Christmas cards. Just address them "Brother in Christ" and sign them using your first name only. Include a few words of encouragement. Cards can not be sealed. Just put them in an envelope and keep it unsealed. Thirdly, we need packages of cookies. They must be store-bought. They can not be in "resealable" packaging. Cookies can not contain any type of liqueur (chocolate or vanilla) and cannot have raisins or powdered sugar on them. Aldi's has great prices and a good variety of packaged cookies. Fourthly, we need decorated placemats (11" X 17"). Placemats should be colorfully decorated with a little message of encouragement. Please use colored pencils, crayons, or markers. Stickers, glitter, and things like that cannot be used. If made by a child they can have the child's first name only and their age. Fifthly, we could use financial donations. 
