

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

My Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday we celebrate Trinity Sunday in the Church as well as Father's Day. First, Happy Father's Day to all of our Fathers, Grandfathers, Godfathers and to the men in our lives who take on a fatherly role of education, protection, formation and guidance! May you, my dear brothers in Christ, know of our love, prayers and gratitude for your life-giving and sacrificial way of life leading and guiding us in this world and leading us to the Kingdom of God!

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. The Trinity is the dynamic unity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit in our one God. The center of this "dynamic" is love. God essentially is the perfection of love. There is much more to this dynamic than the simple word and complex reality we call "love." Wisdom is also part of the divine dynamic. This weekend's first reading from the Book of Proverbs personifies Wisdom. Wisdom is not simply a concept or idea. Wisdom is not seen as only a gift, as we know that wisdom is one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Wisdom, we are reminded, was with God the Father from before creation. In the New Testament we are reminded that Wisdom is revealed in Jesus Christ. Wisdom was not part of creation, but existed before creation. Wisdom plays a role in creation itself. Our theology reminds us that all was created through Christ and all was created for Christ. The personification of Wisdom in the book of Proverbs becomes full and complete in the person of Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ is the Wisdom of the Father and wisdom is a gift of the Holy Spirit given to us at Baptism and Confirmation. How do you define wisdom and recognize wisdom as a gift?

FATHER'S DAY NOVENA CARDS

Novena Cards are at all entrances of the Church. You may place your offering in the collection basket. Intentions will be prayed during the week of June 16.

Although the word "trinity" does not appear anywhere in the Bible, the reality of the Trinity exists throughout the Scripture. We see some hallmark moments of the Trinity in the Bible. Probably the best known moment is Jesus' Baptism in the Jordan by John. We hear the voice of the Father state: "This is my beloved Son, listen to him." We hear the Father's voice, see Jesus in the Jordan River, and we are told that the Holy Spirit descended upon Him. Further in Scripture we learn that as Jesus prepared for His crucifixion, He promised to send the Holy Spirit, the Advocate. We hear Jesus in the Garden praying to the Father for the Father's will to be done and not His own will to be done. After the Resurrection we hear Jesus specifically breathe upon the Apostles and give them the gift of the Holy Spirit. The list can go on and on of many moments where we are given insight into the relationship between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (Pastor's article Continued on page 2)

Many find the Trinity difficult to understand. On one hand I agree, it is difficult to understand one God in three Persons of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. On the other hand, we may be making it more complicated than it really is. How is it that you best relate to the Trinity? Do you identify most with the Father, Son or Holy Spirit? This may be a great Sunday and week to simply reflect on our personal image of God. How is it that you view God the Father? Is the Father a person who is "out to get you" and "watching for every bad move" or is He the Generous Father who is unconditionally forgiving, loving and generous in mercy and charity? What is your image of Jesus the Son, our Savior? Is Jesus simply a "vending machine" for us to get out what we want and need when we pump in enough prayers? Is Jesus simply a figure from history or person who possessed awesome (or magical) power? Can you see Jesus as the perfect expression of the Father who decided to reveal himself to us in a way we could understand, namely, through another human being like us in every way but sin? Can you recognize Jesus as the expression of the Father and the invitation of the Father into a relationship sharing in the dynamic of the triune Godhead? Can you recognize Jesus as the perfect example of sacrificial love? Finally, how do you view the Holy Spirit? Is the Spirit simply a concept of God's presence within us or is the Holy Spirit real, endowing you with gifts to be used to serve the Lord God and others? Is the Holy Spirit the fire and fuel for your life?

Finally, this Sunday, I regret to inform you of another departure from St. Gregory the Great. Our dear Music Director, Daniel Victoor, has submitted his resignation effective August 1, 2019. Daniel has served St. Greg's for eighteen years. He has done an awesome job in every facet of music ministry and his shoes will be hard to fill. Daniel has cultivated our young people in the School and Family Faith Formation to recognize their musical and vocal talents and he has taken seriously the call to work with them to form them as cantors and leaders of worship. On the other side, Daniel has worked with our adults in the same way to draw out their talents and abilities to lead us in worship. He has beautifully lead all of our choirs and opened the door for us to experience many and varied styles and forms of music. Daniel, we thank you and we wish you well. It is not a "good bye" now as we have a month and a half together. Please know you have contributed greatly to St. Greg's and we are profoundly grateful. May God bless you in your new endeavors!







RESPECT LIFE

Happy Father's Day!! "God sets the Father in the family so that by the gifts of his masculinity he can be close to his wife and share everything, joy and sorrow, hope and hardship. And to be close to his children as they grow – when they play and when they work, when they are carefree and when they are distressed, when they are talkative and when they are silent, when they are daring and when they are afraid, when they stray and when they get back on the right path. THE LIFE-CHANGING MES-SAGE OF DIVINE MERCY Ask for His Mercy

Through St. Faustina, Jesus calls us all to ask for His mercy: Souls that make an appeal to My mercy delight Me. To such

souls I grant even more graces than they ask. I cannot punish even the greatest sinner if he makes an appeal to My compassion. (*Diary, 1146*). God, who gave us the gift of free will, will not force anything on us, not even His mercy. He must wait for us to turn away from our sinfulness and ask. (DMM 26) "Ask and it will be given to you...for everyone who asks receives" (Mt 7:7, 8).

Pope John Paul II echoes this scriptural message with a new urgency for our times: "At no time...especially at a moment as critical as our own- can the Church forget the prayer that is a cry for the mercy of God. ...The Church has the right and the duty to appeal to the God of mercy 'with loud cries'" (Rich in Mercy, 15). Jesus tells St. Faustina, Beg for mercy for the whole world (Diary, 570). No soul that has called upon My mercy has ever been disappointed (1541).
