

### FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

### My Dear Parish Family,

As we celebrate this weekend, I am very grateful to inform you that we are moving forward as a parish family in reaching out to our brothers and sisters who may be separated from the parish. I am proud to announce that we welcome Mr. Brian Ruh to our parish staff at St. Gregory the Great. Brian will serve as our Director of Evangelization at St. Greg's. This is a new position and one that I have been hoping to fill for the last few years. You may be thinking, "What does a Director of Evangelization do?"

Every week someone at St. Greg's comments to me that their son, daughter, grandchildren, brother or sister no longer celebrate the sacraments and have stopped "going to church." At St. Greg's we have approximately 2400 registered families we have not heard from in the last two years or more. That is a substantial number of our brothers and sisters in Christ. Given the size of the parish, our number is high, but when put into a per-capita outlook, we are about the same as every parish in the Diocese and really United States. About one-third of registered parishioners of every Parish, fall into the category of "inactive". Little is often done about this because most parishes simply do not have the trained people to reach out and meet these families one by one to discern exactly why they no longer celebrate our faith and invite them back to worship. These "lost souls" are our brothers and sisters in Christ. We have a responsibility to be concerned about them and to seek them out and invite them home. This is the ministry that Brian will lead at St. Greg's.

Brian will focus on reaching out to engage all of us to do the same. He will personally call on families to meet with them and listen to them. He will also call on those interested in this type of ministry to join him. Brian will train our willing parishioners to be involved in this ministry and give them the necessary tools they need to effectively reach out. Brian will also lead various programs to renew all of us in our life of Faith. These programs will be both educational and spiritual in nature. The goal will be to renew each one of us who are regularly involved in our Faith at St. Greg's.

Brian will work alongside Father Thomas Maloney, who has assembled a committee from St. Greg's to personally

visit each person and family who purchases a home in our parish boundaries. This ministry began last month. These parishioners are going to welcome new families in Williamsville, Amherst and Clarence and give them information about our parish and to personally welcome them to worship with us. This committee will also begin going street by street in our parish boundaries, door to door, house to house, to either connect with already registered parishioners or to invite those who may have no parish home or even faith, belief to consider becoming part of the St. Gregory the Great Roman Catholic Parish family.

The Church is essentially missionary in nature. We recall that Jesus Himself sent out the Apostles to heal, teach and preach. We recall that the Apostles formed the church, and we learn both in the Acts of the Apostles and in the Book of Revelation, about the missionary work of the Baptized to evangelize others to Christ.

We are blessed this weekend to welcome Brian Ruh to lead our local effort to do the same missionary work of evangelization. Brian comes to us with nearly thirty years of full time Church ministry experience. He is a lifelong Buffalonian and has served at Our Lady of Victory Services, St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute and twenty-five years at St. Amelia's in Tonawanda. He is a man of deep faith. We welcome Brian along with his wife Patricia and four daughters; Emily, Eden, Monica and Kathleen, to our St. Greg's family.

### (Pastor's Article Continued)

In another important matter, I would like to update you on our position with the "Upon this Rock" campaign. Every January and July we receive our disbursement from the Diocese. As you recall, thirty-five percent of each pledge comes to St. Greg's. As individuals and families pay off their pledges, we receive the thirty-five percent. To date, we have received the following disbursements: \$409,564 (July, 2017); \$106,475 (January, 2018); \$161,172.33 (July, 2018); \$76,698.27 (January, 2019) and we just received \$108,830.66 in July, 2109. This is a total of \$862,740.26 received at St. Greg's. We thank you for your great generosity.

The disbursements from the Upon this Rock mon-\$157,328.66 (AV equipment for the ey include: Church and Ministry Center); \$149,929.72 (Pew removal and replacement in the Church); \$35,350 (Floor Restoration in the Church); \$23,688 (Carpeting of the sanctuary and sacristy and church entrances); \$44,822.73 (Church lighting); \$14,790 (Church painting); \$33,336 (Asbestos removal); \$74,862 (Snowmelt system for church sidewalks); \$7,085 (Structural Column Repair - Church); \$94,144.89 (Architects and project manager for entire Renovation project); \$11,106.28 (Project Extras/additions as project progressed). This is a total of \$646,443.28 in expenditures to date from the Upon This Rock funds. All bills have not been received and paid from the Church renovation project.

As you will recall, the "Upon this Rock" funds were to be used for the renovation of the Church, a potential addition to the School and the balance to establish an endowment fund for St. Greg's. As you know, we are facing the replacement of all parish building roofs in the next few years. Many parishioners have suggested using the "Upon this Rock" fund receipts to assist in that process. This suggestion will be discussed by the parish's Trustees, Executive Council and Finance Council.

Thank you to everyone who is remaining faithful to paying off their "Upon this Rock" pledge. Thank you to all who made a one-time gift and to all who have contributed in any way. I thank those who have made partial payments and felt it necessary to back away from their commitment. I pray and urge you to consider fulfilling your pledge in support of St. Greg's. If you did not make any contribution to the "Upon this Rock" campaign and are pleased to see the work we are accomplishing to beautify, maintain and improve our parish property for current and future use, please consider making a donation now to the parish in response to the letter sent a month ago from the parish finance committee. May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

# UNITED STATES TO RESUME EX-ECUTIONS:

On July 25, Attorney General William Barr announced that executions of federal death-row inmates would resume for the first time since 2003, with five executions scheduled for December 2019 and January 2020. Catholic leaders, including the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), have condemned the decision.

"I am deeply concerned by the announcement of the Justice Department (DOJ) that it will... [return] ...to the death penalty as a form of punishment," said Bishop Frank Dewane, chair of the U.S. bishops' Domestic Justice and Human Development Committee. In 2018, Pope Francis approved updated language for the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* calling the death penalty "inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person." Recently, the U.S. bishops voted overwhelmingly to adopt language "reflecting this position" in the U.S. catechism for adults.

Bishop Dewane urged federal officials to "take this teaching into consideration, as well as the evidence showing its unfair and biased application, and abandon the... plans to [re-implement] the death penalty."

According to the Death Penalty Information Center (DPIC), most federal death penalty sentences come from just three states, Virginia, Texas, and Missouri. More than half of current federal death row inmates are African American, Latino, Asian or Native American.

The Catholic Mobilizing Network (CMN) called the DOJ decision "unconscionable," as the death penalty system in the U.S. "is tragically flawed."

"The actions of the federal government are meant to represent the values of the American people — values of equality, fairness, and for Catholics, above all, a belief in the sanctity of human life," said Krisanne Vaillancourt Murphy, Executive Director of CMN. "The resumption of executions ...flies in the face of these values and promotes a culture of death where we so desperately need a culture of life." (Full text at ncregister.com)
