

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

My Dear Parish Family,

The "Child Victims Act" went into effect on August 14, allowing for a one year window for victims of sexual abuse to file civil lawsuits without a statute of limitations applying.

First and foremost this should be a time of prayer for healing for those who have been abused. It must also be a time of prayer for the grace to be able to forgive. We should be mindful of all those who have suffered abuse, but especially children who have suffered sexual abuse in our Catholic Church, other religious denominations, public or private schools, scouting, athletics, or within their own family. My prayer this week is twofold: healing for victims and the ability to forgive perpetrators.

Please know that we are doing all we can humanly do to ensure the safety of our children in every facet of ministry at St. Gregory the Great Parish. There is a responsibility for every single adult in our church and society to report any knowledge of abuse. As the "Body of Christ" it is our responsibility to protect the entire "Body of Christ." The most vulnerable among us require the most attention.

I urge you to pray. Pray at home. Pray in our Adoration Chapel. Plan this week to make a Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament in our Chapel and pray for the victims of Childhood Sexual Abuse and to pray for the forgiveness needed in everyone's hearts as we must also work to forgive the perpetrators. Our parish's commitment to St. Gregory the Great Catholic School must remain strong as well as our major commitment to our parish's Family Faith Formation, Adult Faith Formation, Evangelization, Youth Ministry, RCIA, Bereavement Ministry, Ministry to the Sick, and more, must continue. I urge you to continue to support the current work of our parish despite the urging of some in various news outlets to stop. As important as this tragedy is, and as important as it is to afford our time and energy upon it, the work and ministry of our parish must also continue. We must be mindful and pray as I stated above, but we must also remember that our eighty plus ministries must continue the work of the "Body of Christ" in the present moment. Our parish's commitment to St. Gregory the Great Catholic School must remain strong as well as our major commitment to our parish's Family Faith Formation, Adult Faith Formation, Evangelization, Youth Ministry, RCIA, Bereavement Ministry, ministry to the sick and more must continue. I urge you to continue to support the current work of our parish despite the urging of some in various news outlets to stop. By stopping your support of current ministry you will really accomplish only one thing. That one thing is hurt to those in the greatest need. I was recently speaking with someone who was very angry over the current scandal. It is justified to be angry, but we cannot let our anger eclipse the call to continue the work of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. This individual, who was a significant contributor to Catholic Charities, told me they withheld their contribution to Catholic Charities this year. He is angry at our Bishop. My only question to him was this: "And who is it that you really hurt by doing that? Did you hurt the Bishop or the poor of Western New York who will now receive fewer services?" The man fell silent and did not answer the question. The same is true for our parish family. As you know we have seen a decline in our Sunday collection. I have been very open and hon-I have worked hard through the est about that. summer along with members of our parish staff and our parish Finance Council members to address our budget for the new fiscal year which begins on September 1st. The budget has been approved which includes a twenty percent decrease in funding for all parish ministries. The work of our parish will continue and our professional parish ministry staff remains intact, but some of the extras will be missing and some of the niceties may be gone. Our ministry will continue and it will be strong. I have not noticed one change in the quality or amount of ministry we are offering at St. Greg's. I pray that you continue to support our ministry at St. Greg's.

As we bring this fiscal year to a close on August 31st, I wish to thank all those who have responded to the Finance Council's request for an extraordinary gift to reduce our deficit. More than \$60,000 has come in and you still have two weeks to make that donation. I ask you to please make a donation for this cause as we are still projecting a deficit for this current fiscal yeI further ask you to please consider increasing your regular Sunday offering. As you may or may not be aware, I do not ask you annually to do that. Some pastors ask their parishioners to increase their Sunday offering every year to meet the rising costs that we all face. Our parish faces the same rising costs of utilities, health insurance premiums for our employees, upkeep, and all the expenses that every household faces. I humbly request that you prayerfully consider increasing your Sunday offering and perhaps consider sacrificing something to be able to do that. Sacrifice is a great thing as it builds our character as members of the "Body of Christ." Although sacrifice may be difficult, it is also beneficial in the end to strengthen us as a person and as a disciple of Christ. Maybe consider sacrificing the stop at the local coffee drive-thru, and brew a cup at home before you leave for work. Maybe consider sacrificing a cocktail or bottle of wine or dessert when you go out to dinner, or maybe consider sacrificing purchasing a piece of clothing, especially if the closet has enough clothes in it already. Please consider joining me in sacrificing for our parish. I have made the commitment to sacrifice for St. Greg's and I ask you to do the same. It is up to us, in this place and time, to remain faithful and grow beyond any anger or hurt to continue to serve one another as the "Body of Christ" at St. Gregory the Great Parish in Williamsville, New York.

May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.

#### WHO IS ST. FAUSTINA?

**Pope John Paul II** visited the tomb of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in Poland on June 7, 1997. There he said:

There is nothing that man needs more than Divine Mercy - that love which is benevolent, which is compassionate, which raises man above his weak-

ness to the infinite heights of the holiness of God.

In this place, we become particularly aware of this. From here went out the message of Divine Mercy that Christ Himself chose to pass on to our generation through [St.] Faustina.

And it is a message that is clear and understandable for everyone. Anyone can come here, look at this image of the merciful Jesus, His Heart radiating peace, and hear in the depths of his own soul what [St.] Faustina heard: Fear nothing; I am always with you (Diary, 586). And if this person responds with a sincere heart, "Jesus, I trust in you," he will find comfort in all his anxieties and fears. ...

From the diary of this young polish nun a special devotion to the mercy of God is spreading. The message is nothing new, just a reminder of what the Church has always taught: that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness.

But, in the Divine Mercy devotion, the message takes on a powerful new focus, calling people to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone, especially poor sinners: The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy (Diary, 723).

Some of the elements of this new focus include a sacred image of the Merciful Savior, several new prayers, and a cornucopia of promises. But the **main elements** are **trust** and **deeds of mercy**. The devotional practices proposed in the *Diary of St. Faustina* are completely in accordance with the teachings of the Church and are firmly rooted in the Gospel message of our Merciful Savior.

#### Archbishop Denounces Recent Gun Violence:

In his August 5 column, Philadelphia Archbishop Charles Chaput,

who was Archbishop of Denver during the Columbine High School massacre, commented on the shootings in Gilroy, CA, Dayton, OH, and El Paso, TX.

"The real problem [of Columbine-like violence] is... in us ... [Our] culture ...markets violence in dozens of ...ways...When we build our advertising campaigns on consumer selfishness and greed, and when money [determines one's] value, how can we be surprised when our sense of community erodes? When we glorify and multiply guns, why are we shocked when kids use them?

When we answer murder with more violence in the death penalty, we put the state's seal of approval on revenge. When the most dangerous place ... is a mother's womb..., [it sends the] message that life isn't ... sacred. ... Certain kinds of killing we enshrine as rights and protect by law. When we live this kind of contradiction, why are we surprised at the results?

I buried some of the young Columbine victims 20 years ago, [and] I ...saw the human wreckage that gun violence leaves behind. The experience taught me that assault rifles are not a birthright, and the Second Amendment is not a Golden Calf. I support thorough background checks and more restrictive access to guns for anyone seeking to purchase them.

But it also taught me that only a fool can believe that "gun control" will solve the problem of mass violence. The people *using* the guns ... are moral agents with twisted hearts. And the twisting is done by the culture of sexual anarchy, personal excess, political hatreds, intellectual dishonesty, and perverted freedoms that we've ... created over the past half-century.

Treating the symptoms in a culture of violence doesn't work. We need to look deeper. Until we're willing to do that, nothing fundamental will change." (Full text at catholicphilly.com)
