> I believe that our basic respect for human life begins with conception. The moment we go from "nothing" to "something" is that moment of conception and almost immediate cell division taking place. It is interesting to note that the egg of a bald eagle is protected under the law since the Lacey Act of 1900 and has had more protections added over the last century. At the same time, the egg of a human being is not protected. It seems we understand that a fertilized egg of a bald eagle is a bald eagle and is protected, but we do not recognize that a fertilized egg of a human being is a human being. Great Saints have emerged in choosing unborn human life over their own, such as St. Gianna Molla. If you do not know this great physician's story, please look it up and learn from her. The list of issues facing our society regarding a respect for human life is long. I mentioned a few above in detail, but the list includes bullying, the misuse of prescription drugs (most notably the opioid crisis), elder abuse, suicide, the fair distribution of resources so that all people may simply be able to live, and the constant calls for relief efforts in light of natural disasters such as earthquakes, floods, hurricanes and more. All of these issues concern human life.

We need to reflect upon a consistent ethic of life. This was a proposal from the late Cardinal Joseph Bernadine. Cardinal Bernadine put forward that there is only one fundamental question to be answered. That question is: "Do you support human life or not?" He said, once you answer that fundamental question then every issue which affects human life is also answered. His reasoning is simple: either you consistently support life or you do not. These are not isolated issues we confront in our lives, but are fully related to one another.

Perhaps the reason we see so many issues facing us in an increasing amount and intensity is that we are now seeing generations born and raised with an education that human life is disposable. It is logical to conclude that if unborn human life is disposable, then born life is disposable. If born life is disposable, then my life is disposable and I can choose to dispose of my own life or even someone else's life if it suits me. If we continue to promote a culture of death beginning in the womb, then it stands to reason a culture of death will also be promoted outside of the womb.

In our country we spend billions of dollars to address many of the issues I stated above in order to study their cause and how to solve them. I submit to you the answer is simple and free: support human life from conception to natural death. Once you make that fundamental decision, a culture of life will be restored and our youth will grow in a culture that supports their lives and does not teach them to question that gift. I believe we would see a decrease in the use of artificial means to try to "feel good" about an individual life or to terminate a life in any circumstance.

If any of these issues concern you, I invite you to join me in standing for human life on Niagara Falls Boulevard next Sunday, October 6th. There is in formation in this Bulletin about our departure and return to St. Greg's for this one hour, silent and prayerful stand for human life. Please join me; life is too precious not to come. May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.



SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptism, Reconciliation and Eucharist

for Older Children: Typically, children receive Baptism as infants and prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist when they are in Grades 2 and 3. Occasionally, when this does not happen, they need to prepare for these Sacraments when they are older. Here at St. Gregory's, we have a process for these children and their families. Children and their families and/or sponsors are placed in a Children's Catechumenate and the process is called

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults). Through this process, older children who have missed any of these Sacraments will prepare to receive Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation as needed. If you have a family member, ages 7-18, who needs preparation for a missed Sacrament(s), please contact Joan Rischmiller

THE CEMETERY OF THE INNOCENTS



Since 1973, over 60 MILLION unborn children have lost their lives to abortion. In 2017, more than 105,000 abortions or 12.2% of the national total were performed in New York State, the abortion capital of the US

(Guttmacher.org). That is 288 abortions every day.

The Cemetery of the Innocents, located on the Ministry Center lawn facing Maple Road, is an effort by the St. Gregory

the Great Respect Life Committee to raise awareness of the millions of unborn lives lost and the millions more mothers, fathers, and families wounded through abortion. Initially, it was created by parishioners Rose and Harvey Hoelscher who were dedicated to this observance for many years. Following a short lapse, the memorial was reinstated through the efforts of Jay DiPasquale with funding provided by the St. Greg's chapter of the Knights of Columbus. Thanks to the help of volunteers from the American Heritage Girls Troop 3129 and the Boy Scouts Troop 440, the memorial is again in place and will remain during October in observance of Respect Life Month.

MASS CELEBRATIONS IN AMHERST

Our Amherst community is blessed by many faithful Catholics who participate in the Sunday Eucharist at five churches: Saint Benedict, Christ the King, Saint Gregory the Great, Saint Leo the Great and Saints Peter and Paul. Each of these Parishes is less than 2 miles from their neighbor.

At a recent meeting, we Pastors of these Parishes all shared our difficulty in providing priests, music ministers and liturgical ministers to sustain the current Mass schedules in Amherst. Four of the five parishes now have only one priest and the availability of priests for weekend and/or emergency assistance is severely diminished. Furthermore, studying the Mass schedule survey conducted by the Diocese in Spring 2018, we observed that there was often a replication of Masses at the same time resulting in more-than-half-empty worship spaces.

As Pastors our fervent desire is to provide vibrant celebrations of the Eucharist and to offer a variety of opportunities for Mass that can be sustained within the Amherst community. To achieve this we have agreed to work together on coordinating our Mass schedules to provide a sustainable variety of opportunities for the Sunday Eucharist without needless duplication. We will be reaching out to lay leaders in our community for their input.

We believe that if each Parish reduces the number of Sunday Masses by one, and creates Mass schedules that accommodate individual Parish Ministerial needs without duplicating neighboring schedules, we will be able to sustain a variety of Mass opportunities for our Amherst community.


