From The Desk of the Pastor

My dear parish family, as we come near the end of the Easter Season, we are so blessed to be celebrating First Holy Communion for our Third Grade children this coming weekend. Congratulations to all of our children and their parents as we gather to celebrate this awesome moment. Thank you also to all of our parents who have taken their role to be the first teachers of their children in the way of faith and to bring their children to this great moment. Congratulations and God's blessings.

I wish to share with you the many positive elements in our parish family, especially since I shared some of the challenges facing us in last week's Bulletin. First, our school is strong and doing very well. We continue to be open for enrollment for next year and encourage everyone to consider a Catholic Education here at St. Gregory the Great School. We just had an awesome Eighth Grade day of recollection as well as the Eighth Grade class day which focused on honoring our Blessed Mother Mary and the crowning of her statue. The Eighth Graders will be going on their class trip to Boston in another week.

Our Youth Ministry continues to grow. We are so pleased that about two dozen teens participated in the High- School Life Teen weekend retreat a couple weekends ago and about three dozen teens participated in the Edge retreat this weekend. Recently we had 29 young adults turn out for a night we hosted at the Anchor Bar with our newly formed Young-Adult Ministry. It is fair to say that we have over two hundred teens involved in both the Edge and Life Teen Youth Ministry programs. That is an excellent number of young people. The group is vibrant and alive! It is awesome to see such a great response to our college and young-adult ministry program in so short a time period. Finally, we had an awesome response to the teen-girl's retreat day this past Saturday, coordinated by Lori Hogg.

Easter was a great moment to see the strength of our RCIA process. We celebrated four Baptisms and received three-previously Baptized in other Christian faiths to the Catholic Church. We also Confirmed eight adults in addition to those received into the Church. We also celebrated 110 First Holy Communions. The RCIA is a sign of the strength of the parish and of the Church as a whole. Our newly initiated are a strong sign to us of the life of the Church as they desire to become part of the life of our faith and parish community.

There are many signs of strength in our parish and diocese during these difficult times. Although our Church continues to suffer the effects of the clergy abuse from the past, and although our parish and diocese has fewer active and practicing Catholics than before, the church is strong. I am reminded of a former Archbishop of Ottawa who was legendary for greeting you with a hand-crushing handshake. His handshake probably could have crushed your bones into a fine powder as he was so strong. As he strongly shook your hand, he greeted you and said: "The Church is still strong." Yes, even though there may be a decline in the number of people actively celebrating the Sacraments, and a decline in the number of those who wish to actively live the faith we profess, the church is still strong in you and me. From the Desk of the Pastor (cont'd from pg. 1)

The greatest challenges we have right now are not any of those I have mentioned above or in last weekend's article. The greatest challenge we have is continuing to live an authentic faith and not just be "Catholic" in name. I often meet individuals who feel that they no longer come to church, either at St. Greg's or in general, because they feel they are "good" people and although they do not believe in many of the teachings of the Church, they consider themselves to be "good" Catholics. This is a dangerous thought process.

In Mk 10:17 Jesus is asked by a young man what he must do to share in eternal life? In Mk 10:18 Jesus replies by asking "Why do you call me good? No one is good except God alone" Jesus then goes on to instruct the young man to follow the commandments and when the young man replies that he has done this, Jesus tells him that if he wants to be perfect to go and sell what he has and give it to the poor and then to follow after Him.

What makes someone a "good" Catholic? That is a difficult question to answer, but my understanding of a "good" Catholic is to be a person who strives to trust, believe and live to the best of their ability the truth of the Catholic Church's teachings. We all fail and sin, but a "good" Catholic is one who realizes that the Church is correct and the Gospel of Jesus is correct and when we fall short it is the person who needs to change, and not the Church that needs to change to conform to the person. "good" Catholic does fall short and sin, but that same "good" Catholic picks him (her) self up and plows forward with renewed hope and energy to live the truth regardless of its hard work or cost. "good" Catholic lives in the church that we know today with the teachings we have. They do not live in a church that they think should be, with teachings that need to be changed. Our Church has seen many changes in 2000 years, but the truth has never changed in faith and morals. The "good" Catholic strives to live the total truth of faith and morals as we know them and not simply pick and choose which ones to follow.

Next week I will develop this understanding of "good" further. For now, be filled with hope even though we have some challenges in our Faith and Church. May God bless you, our Mother Mary watch over you and St. Gregory the Great intercede for you, always.
