Many of you know us from our various clothing and food drives... we are very grateful for your donations. The Furniture Team loads our "big, yellow truck" with couches, dining sets, appliances and more from generous donors, delivering it downtown to the Main Street SVDP store. This not-for-profit store is an outlet for those seeking basic furnishings, sometimes as little as having a bed to sleep in tonight.

The Dispatch Team connects callers, whether those seeking help or those wanting to donate, with our <u>Response Team.</u> teams work together to answer questions and provide information on available community resources, as well as delivering on those resources. Perhaps a bag or two of food is the caller's only need to get by for another week. Our Food Pantry, made possible through your donations at food drives, enables us to fill these requests. Need is found not only in our communities but also in our hospitals and prisons. The Hospital Visits Team can be found each Sunday visiting patients at Millard Fillmore Suburban with encouragement, a listening ear and prayer. The Kairos Prison Ministry, a Christian faith-based program, facilitates and attends to inmates' spiritual needs at Wende Maximum Security Prison In Alden.




