

From The Desk of Fr. Paul Cygan

So... you may be wondering, "How is the new priest holding up in the biggest parish in the diocese?" That is a very good question. By the time that this Bulletin will be out in circulation on Saturday, October 13th, I will have been a priest for four months and 13 days! But who is counting, right? Still, this thought makes me reflect on what has happened the past few months and how I have lived out the priesthood in my life. So far the priesthood has been an incredible joy and a fulfilling vocation.

Let me tell you about some of those joys that I have found within our Church. In fact, it really has been a rediscovery of the beauty of the Sacraments for me. First and foremost, being able to celebrate the Mass is one of the greatest joys that I have ever experienced. Every single day, I get to consecrate the Eucharist, lifting up the bread and wine then changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. The sense of unworthiness, love and amazement are all present for me at that moment. But then, I get to see how the Eucharist animates the entire congregation. I am moved by the prayerfulness, the devotion, the reverence and love that people have for the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

One of the Sacraments I was honestly nervous about was Confession. My experience of the Sacrament of Reconciliation before the priesthood has only been my own personal Confessions. However, I have an acute awareness now of the grace that is present in the confessional. God has revealed to me a little more about how great His mercy, love and forgiveness are!

Most of all, I am moved by the faithfulness of the people of God. So many of you have come up to me and shared their stories, their struggles, their lives and how they serve God. Listening to these stories has been a profound witness for me of how to strive for holiness in my own life with the help of God's grace.
