From the desk of Deacon Peter Donnelly

I often hear from new parishioners that our parish is "so big" and that it's a challenge to figure out how to get involved. When my family arrived over twenty years ago, I had similar feelings. Over time, though, I came to think differently. You are all, if nothing else, a persistent bunch, and casual conversations soon became invitations to many different ministry experiences. I found that acquaintances soon became friends and friends became part of my bigger family. You got to me. When I was considering entering diaconate formation, it was your conversations and challenges that pushed me to say "yes" to the call that I was hearing. When I struggled with the demands of formation and opening myself to God in new ways, it was your prayers that kept me going. And when I was ordained, I was filled with joy knowing that you had walked by my side the entire way. You saw something in me that I couldn't, and for that I am eternally grateful and in your debt.

Which is why this letter is difficult to write.

As some of you may have heard, effective November 1st, I have been assigned to serve as deacon at St. John the Baptist parish in Alden. While this new challenge is exciting, it also makes me sad as this chapter of my ministry comes to a close. It seems like we were just getting started, yet it's already time to move Before leaving on a new assignment, though, I wanted to make sure that you knew how much you mean to me. Together we have celebrated Baptisms, Mission, and all of the little things that make life so interesting and exciting. We've also shared the sadness of burying loved ones, struggling through difficult times and just trying to figure out how to make it through another day. I wouldn't trade any of this for a lifetime supply of Reese's Cups. You've shown me that God is alive in the world in so many unexpected ways. (continued on page 2)

No matter where I go, St. Greg's (not the building, but you - the people) will always be my home. I'd like to leave you with one final thought and, possibly, give away a little secret. Each Sunday the deacon has a choice of a couple phrases to use in closing the Mass. Almost without exception, I close with, "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." I use that because I am convinced that you are the messengers, the apostles, who announced the Gospel of the Lord and impacted my life so profoundly. So, each time I close the Mass I offer those words as a reminder of how important each of you are. You never know who might be listening - I was. Please continue to be the voice of God in the world. 



Respect Life

Pope Francis On Abortion: In his general audience on October 10, Pope Francis remarked on abortion during a reflection on the fifth commandment, "Thou shall not kill."

"Is it right to take a human life to solve a problem? It's like hiring a hitman," Pope Francis said.

"Violence and the rejection of life are born from fear." For this reason, parents who learn that their unborn child will have a disability need "real closeness, true solidarity to face reality; overcoming understandable fears." Pope Francis lamented that parents receiving a difficult prenatal diagnosis often "receive hasty advice to stop the pregnancy."

It is contradictory to suppress "human life in the womb in the name of safeguarding other rights.... How can an act that suppresses innocent and helpless life in its blossoming be therapeutic, civil, or simply human?"

"One could say that all the evil done in the world is summarized in this: contempt for life. What leads man to reject life? They are the idols of this world: money, power, success. These are incorrect parameters to evaluate life. The only authentic measure of life is love, the love with which God loves it!"

The positive meaning of the fifth commandment is that "God is a lover of life."

"In every sick child, in every weak old man, in every desperate migrant, in every fragile and threatened life, Christ is looking for us, ... for our heart, to disclose the joy of love. It is worthwhile to accept every life because every man is worth the blood of Christ. We cannot despise what God so loved! ... While a sick child or an elderly person who needs assistance can be viewed as a burden, this can actually be 'a gift from God.' This vulnerable life can 'pull me out of self -centeredness and make me grow in love'." (Full text at catholicnewsagency.com)
