There are so many beautiful aspects of our Church that cannot be taken away from us, for example the fact that the Mass never changes and we have incredible saints to look to as role models.

Do we need to ignore the issues at hand in our Church? No, not at all. I am reminded of a metaphor I learned while preparing to teach the middle schoolers about purgatory. When gold is created it has to go through immense amounts of heat to make that gold pure. We are currently going through that immense amount of heat to make our Church pure again, but we need strong Catholics to help the Church endure this here. We have to be the light of faith to so many who are stuck in the darkness and are being suffocated by this heat.

St. Joan of Arc is an incredible example of a person rising in spite of the difficulties around them. This Saint followed her faith until the very end. She was surrounded by soldiers that completely doubted her faith and then the people who she fought for actually turned against her. She could have abandoned her faith so that she could live, but she did not. She gave her life to her faith by completely following God's will and eventually becoming a martyr.

Now I am not saying that you need to physically give up your life, but metaphorically yes. If we try to understand what has happened and take control then we can never truly lead those around us back home to the Church. We cannot control God's will, even if it is extremely difficult. The moment we give up our life to the Lord we can find the beauty in this darkness and show them why the Church is their home.
